





Annual Report

The GOCC Legacy Fund was established in 2014 to create an ongoing source of funds for local area charitable organizations. The purpose is to be a means for community philanthropy that enables individuals of both modest and substantial means to help build a community with a loving heart.

In 2017 the Legacy Fund awarded the first annual gift of \$5,000 to Air Mobile Ministries. This gift provided enough funds for 2 water treatment systems, along with 6 other systems from matching funds donated by members of our congregation!

Since its inception 35 members of our congregation have joined the Legacy Fund, giving or pledging gifts in the form of cash, stocks, beneficiary funds, or other options of estate planning. In just 4 short years 35 members have made the decision to include the Great Outdoors Community Church in their estate planning. The Christmas dinner project that we shopped for and gave money for turkeys was a wonderful success. We distributed 298 bags and 208 turkey vouchers. Some of the food was used to feed 400 people at Sandpoint Park. Any leftover food was sent to food banks, There was also a free dinner at Indian Civic Center, but not associated with our project.

As a side note, Titusville has a homeless cold night shelter this year for the first time. Many churches rotate responsibility for evening and breakfast meals. They have had up to 31 people, including children. The SPCA takes the animals.





HOUSE OF HOPE PRINT SHOP

Brazilian missionaries in the area outlined with a heart want to make sure all the indigenous groups there have God's Word in their language as soon as possible. They have urgently needed a way to print the translations in the various languages. **Thanks to GOCC, now they have it!**



Over the years, **Carlos Correia** & his wife **Daisy**, have developed many outstanding ministries to help the 30,000 people who live in the Oiapoque area (which includes 7,000 Indians living in 37 villages.) One of these is the House of Hope Church & Rescue Mission in the town of Oiapoque, which gives much-needed help to 300 at-risk children and elderly people.

In August 2017, Pastor Carlos set up a Print Shop right next to the church. Meanwhile, in Orlando, our own Bob Bates trained Carlos' son Tim and the son of our own Harold and Diana Green, David, to use and maintain the printing equipment. Then David and Tim took all the equipment down to Brazil and set it up.

The Print Shop will be printing Scripture as soon as it is translated in the various Indian languages, as well as teaching material for the churches and Christian ministries in town. The Print Shop also provides an opportunity to give **practical** training to homeless street kids, so they can learn a trade. Any commercial printing they do will help support the House of Hope's many worthwhile outreaches. Since there is no other way to get books and pamphlets printed in Oiapoque, the equipment will be a huge blessing for everyone!

Pastor Ameen Rafique has been ministering faithfully in a very remote, poverty stricken area of Pakistan for the last 13 years, following his graduation from the Lahore Bible Institute in 2004. 
