

Reflections from our Pastor

The Power Of Thanksgiving

During the 1800's E.P. Scott was a missionary to India. One day he met a native Indian tribesman in traditional costume. He learned that the tribesman was from a ferocious mountain tribe that rarely came to the city.

After much prayer, Scott set out to find the tribe. He took a few meager provisions and his violin.

Two days later a party of warriors suddenly surrounded Scott, pointing their spears at his heart. The missionary was sure death was imminent, but in a moment of inspiration he reached for his violin and began playing the hymn, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name." He sang the words in the tribesmen's own language.

When he came to the stanza 'Let ev'ry kindred, ev'ry tribe', he cautiously opened his eyes. He was amazed to find tribesmen lowered their spears; many of them were crying.


For the next two and a half years Scott lived with this tribe, sharing the gospel with them. After a brief visit to the city, Scott returned and spent the rest of his life with them – dying as an old man in their village.

Who could have imagined the power of a hymn of praise and thanksgiving in such a dire moment?

This Thanksgiving ... let's take a cue from E.P. Scott and give the God of the universe the thanks and praise due to Him.

Attendees included couples and singles from the church and the TGO community in general. Speakers included Titusville's Mayor, Jim Tulley and CSA's new manager, Billy Specht. Lunch was catered by Sonny's barbeque and the event was opened by Pastor David Price. Members of the GOCC Singles Steering Committee had planned the event and Singles served on the buffet line and worked in other ways to make everyone comfortable and ensure the event's success.

During his remarks, Mayor Tulley handed out copies of the "Titusville Talking Points" report on the city. Tulley spoke about the renaissance in the City and responded to a number of questions from the audience. 


Prison Book Project is now 22 years old. We have operated with no paid staff since the beginning and still do so.

While labor is free, shipping is not. Neither is facility space. The cost to rent warehouse space is rapidly depleting our "Building Fund Reserve". Without warehouse space, we will not be able to operate. In the last four years we have distributed 1.1 million books. There are 250 tons of books in our warehouse with more arriving daily.

To continue to operate Prison Book Project, we must build our donor base. The number of facilities requesting material is also increasing. We serve more than 2,000 facilities and still have approximately 900 on our waiting list.

If we can get 300 additional contributors to donate \$25.00 a month we will be able to continue to Touch Lives Behind Bars for now.

We need to get these books into the hands that need them. Lives are being changed. 95% of the people incarcerated today will be back on the streets in the future. The Gospel will make the difference. Will you be one of the 300?


