The God who is "with us" can give us a fresh start. He can inspire us to new things. He can rekindle our love for others. He can give us new insights for the road ahead.


In 2020, some things may change for the better, while others may challenge our faith and endurance. One thing will not change: God is with us.



Knitted Knockers Mission Statement

To connect volunteer knitters and crocheters with <u>breast cancer survivors</u> to offer free Knitted Knockers to any woman who wants them. There is a huge demand for Knitted Knockers that can't be met by any one group but together we can do it! If someone in each area will set a goal of meeting the need in just their county it can happen!

Knitted Knockers are special handmade <u>breast prosthesis</u> for women who have <u>undergone mastectomies</u> or <u>other procedures to the breast</u>. Traditional breast prosthetics are usually expensive, heavy, sweaty and uncomfortable. They typically require special bras or camisoles with pockets and can't be worn for weeks after surgery. Knitted Knockers on the other hand are soft, comfortable, beautiful and when placed in a regular bra they take the shape and **feel** of a real breast.

- 1) <u>Volunteer knitters and crocheters</u>: We will furnish the patterns and the yarn or, if you'd like to provide the yarn, we will furnish you with a list of approved yarns)
- 2) If you don't knit or crochet, but would like to help:
 - A. Yarn: Special yarn is used, one of which can be purchased at Wal-

Mart. Here is a photo of the Wal-Mart yarn - Coboo by Lion Brand. This taupe/flesh color is the most popular, but any color

is truly appreciated!

DID YOU KNOW?

All facets of **HELPING HANDS MINISTRY** are **AVAILABLE TO ANYONE IN TGO**, not just church attendees.

If you have a neighbor who has had surgery and is returning home alone, we can <u>provide meals</u> for up to 3 weeks; <u>provide medical equipment to help with rehab</u>; <u>provide transportation to rehab, grocery store or doctor</u>. If they, or you, need help in rehab, we have a <u>Lending Closet with all sorts of walkers, canes, wheel-chairs, raised toilet seats, shower chairs, etc.</u> Just call and ask!

We also have a <u>baby lending closet</u> with items for visiting grandchildren, such as Pack'n Play cribs, walkers, strollers, toys, booster and car seats and high chairs.

Lesser used, but available, are <u>handymen to help with "honey-do" items</u> you can no longer do, especially if it means climbing a ladder.

Even lesser known, our **Respite Care Ministry helps caregivers with sitters**, who come to sit with their loved one so the caregiver can go out. We also help with someone alone, coming home from the hospital and needing to be checked on; or a list of paid caregivers, if necessary.

The last part of our ministry is the <u>County Services Liaison</u>. <u>We are aware of services available in the county</u> <u>that may be helpful to you</u>, such as Meals on Wheels, free hand holds installed, free ramps built. Also, we are familiar with the Assisted Living and Nursing Homes available in this area and the costs and criteria to move into them.

BIBLE LESSON PROGRAM CONTINUES TO GROW

For more than 50 years, Good News has presented a Bible correspondence program to men and women behind bars. Today, all 224 lessons are now available in KJV, ESV and Spanish. More lessons are in development as students want to press on beyond the current curriculum. 




