Dear Friends:

As we approach Thanksgiving, I share an old story, but one I think has lasting impact. It's a story of giving thanks to God no matter what is happening in our lives.

Martin Rinkart was a 17th-century Lutheran pastor in the village of Eilenberg, Saxony. He began his ministry during a brutal time in European history called the "Thirty-Years War."

Throughout the war, thousands of people fled to the walled city of Eilenberg, attempting to avoid plague and famine. Still, at one point, so many were dying that Martin Rinkart was doing fifty funerals a day.

We can only imagine how difficult it must have been for Rinkart to be daily surrounded by death, grief, and mourning. Yet, in that very time, he penned one of the greatest Thanksgiving hymns of all time:

"Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices, Who wondrous things hath done, in whom this world rejoices; Who from our mother's arms hath blessed on our way, With countless gifts of love, and still is ours today."

Today, no matter what you are facing, you can give God thanks. You can remember His "countless gifts of love" and be convinced that God is still in control of your life.

MISSION NOTES - NOVEMBER 2019

Remember to return your Operation Christmas Child Shoe Boxes by <u>**November 17**</u>th. Please do not put in any liquids, candy, toothpaste or toys that look like weapons. Last year we gave 264 boxes, the year before that was 284. Our goal this year is 300. We can do it!

The week of November 24th we'll set up an **ANGEL TREE**. This year the Angel Tree will be collecting toys/ clothing for children in North Brevard for two agencies: North Brevard Charities and a church that is meeting at the Gibson Youth Center.

Coming in late November or early December we will be showing the "Jesus" film that is shown around the world by various missionaries. Look for further information.

What's been happening with our Missions:

<u>Samaritan's Purse</u>: Category 5 Hurricane Dorian devastated the Bahamas wiping out entire towns and wrecking medical facilities. Samaritan's Purse launched an airlift using their DC-8 cargo plane to deploy Emergency Field Hospital and deliver tarps, water filters and other lifesaving supplies. They chartered an ocean-going barge to deliver emergency supplies to Abaco. Nearly 70,000 people live on these islands and most lost their homes. They set up a 40-bed hospital that includes emergency room that can handle 100 patients a day, an operating room where up to 10 surgeries a day can be done, an intensive care unit, a delivery room and a fully stocked pharmacy. Please pray for the people of the Bahamas.

Wycliffe Associates: President and CEO Bruce Smith "My heart is breaking with the latest news out of Cameroon. Tears still fill my eyes thinking about a precious Bible translator in West Africa who was brutally murdered in the middle of the night. He and his wife and several others were dragged out of their house and attacked mercilessly. Terror has ripped through this community and grief hangs heavy in every heart. I can't help but have my mind fill with questions.

What would I say to a grieving wife of a national Bible translator who just watched her husband hacked to death by a group of blood-thirsty men? What would I say to her when she wakes up in a hospital room missing an arm? What would I say to their five kids who no longer have a father and whose mother will not be able to work the family farm? I don't know.

But I do know that this national translator paid the ultimate price. Unflinching in the face of imminent danger, great will be his <u>reward</u> in heaven! Please pray with us! Please join us in prayer for this precious family and the entire community affected by this tragedy. The grief they are experiencing is overwhelming . . . but I have heard that they will not let this stop their Bible translation efforts. In neighboring regions, these brothers and sisters have seen the impact God's Word can have on the hearts of men. The power of Scripture has brought warring communities to reconciliation and peace . . . and let's pray that this will be true in this region as well.

Wycliffe Translators: John and Bonnie Nystrom:

Some of the translators started a "Basic Exegesis" course, learning how to properly interpret Bible passages. Please pray for them in that.

Please pray for our partner Ben Pherson, who is working this week with the Arop translators on their translation of John's gospel.

Normally, that's my job and Ben has plenty of other work to do, *so please pray* that the Lord would help us complete our partnership team so I can focus on translation again.

Stride Ministries - Evans:

Has completed two retreats for his airmen, one was Labor Day Weekend the other Archery Elk Hunting September 4-13th. "My teaching theme for the hunt is Godly Husbands & Fathers. These are our memory verses:

- Ephesians 6:4 Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.
- 1 Peter 3:7 In the same way, you husbands must give honor to your wives. Treat your wife with understanding as you live together. She may be weaker than you are, but she is your equal partner in God's gift of new life. Treat her as you should so your prayers will not be hindered.

October in Review






