Grant us peace to use them reverently, as from Thy hands, with thankful hearts: let Thy blessing rest upon these Thy good creatures, to our comfort and sustentation: and grant we humbly beseech Thee, good Lord, that as we doe hunger and thirst for this food of our bodies, so our soules may earnestly long after the food of eternal life, through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour, Amen.

Thanksgiving – The Pilgrims' Perspective

Dear Friends,

As I write this month's Reflections article, once again I think back to our nation's rich history. It is filled with stories of people who persevered, despite life's difficulties. As we come to another Thanksgiving holiday, it would be good to remember one of those stories.

On April 5, 1621, a small group of Pilgrims stood on the beach and watched as the Mayflower slowly sailed out of Plymouth harbor for the return trip to England.

Spring was finally emerging after a bitter and disastrous winter. Nothing could have prepared that small band for the harsh realities of building a settlement, while fighting off starvation and sickness.

At the close of that first winter, 50 of the original 102 Mayflower passengers had died. They were buried on Cole's Hill overlooking Plymouth Harbor.

It's remarkable that none of the Pilgrims decided to board the Mayflower and return to England that spring day in 1621. Instead, they decided to stay in the wilderness and continue their New World experiment.

Their story reminds us of what Hebrews 11:15 says about the heroes of faith: "If they had longed for the country they came from, they could have gone back."

That fall, Governor William Bradford announced a time of celebration thanking God for his blessings. The Pilgrims invited the Wampanoag Indians to join them. They owed them a great debt for helping them plant life-sustaining crops that previous spring.

400 years later, our nation that sprang from that small band of Pilgrims is again facing numerous challenges. Our New World experiment seems to be in jeopardy.

This Thanksgiving let's remember the Puritan's example of perseverance. Let's seek the same Savior they trusted and committed their very survival to.
