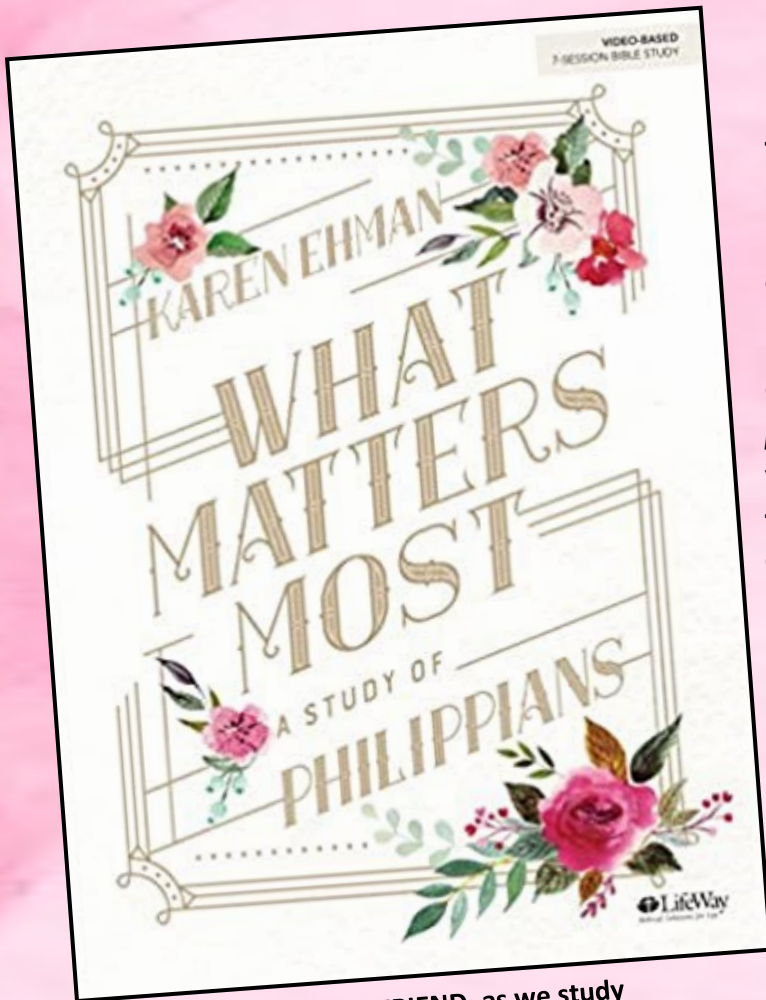

SAMARITAN'S PURSE: OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD EVENT

On Saturday, September 10, 2022, the Space Coast Area Team had an event with an actual shoe box recipient from the Ukraine. Flyers were sent out, announcements were made, and the event was attended by approximately 400 people.

There were also “connect stations.” where those in attendance could learn all about the process of Operation Christmas Child; from prayer, to project leaders, to the filling and collection of boxes, delivering the boxes to collection locations and finally, shipping the boxes off all over the world.

The event concluded with games and a pizza. This was an opportunity for local churches to receive a carton of 50 shoe boxes for their congregations to bless and fill with goodies and the Gospel.

From Mess to Masterpiece By Barb Hoffmann, Church Relations Coordinator

The afternoon rain did not dampen the spirits of the 400 folks who attended the Space Coast Area Team’s “From Mess to Masterpiece” event on Saturday, September 10, 2022, at First Baptist Church Cocoa.

Brevard County’s Operation Christmas Child (OCC) church and community project leaders, as well as local pastors, families, and shoebox donors gathered in the church’s sanctuary to hear guest speaker Mariya Tatarin share how the gift of an OCC shoebox impacted her life when she was a young child in Ukraine.

Before Tatarin spoke, the youth band of First Baptist Cocoa, Everlasting Rock led in praise and worship. Lynne Phillips, area director for the Space Coast Area Team (SCAT) introduced local pastors, as well as the members of SCAT.

Also in attendance was Anita Burns, Director, Florida/Puerto Rico Region, OCC; and Butch and Beverly Gardner, Regional Coordinators, Florida/Puerto Rico, OCC .

While the adults met, 25 children, grades K- 5 enjoyed their own program as they watched OCC’s video story of Lola’s Lion and discussed the importance of shoebox gifts. Each child also received a stuffed animal.

Tatarin, originally from Ukraine told how when she was 10, God used her shoebox gifts to forgive and befriend schoolmates who bullied her because of her faith in Jesus. One gift of crayons in her box encouraged her to pursue her artistic talent and interest. Now married and a new mother, she is also a public-school art teacher in Cleveland, Ohio, sharing her faith and love of art with her students.

After Tatarin’s testimony, attendees were invited into the church’s activities center where there were 9 CONNECT display tables, an art experience and games for children, pizza and salad, and a room for attendees to pick up cartons of pre-printed OCC shoeboxes.

CONNECT tables provided an opportunity to learn about the local work of the Space Coast Area Team providing information and materials about Church Relations, Prayer, Community Relations, Student Relations and Drop Off/Logistics. Other tables included: How to pack a quality shoebox; The Greatest Journey (12-week discipleship program for children); a table for project leaders to ask questions; and a guest book for attendees to sign as a gift for special speaker Tatarin.

“I enjoyed hearing Mariya’s testimony about how the shoebox that God meant for her to have was an answer to prayer and impacted her life,” said Karen White, Project Leader, Calvary Baptist Church, Melbourne.

“And the Space Coast Area Team did a wonderful job providing everything needed for a well-planned program, including a room filled with display tables and OCC materials to explore, as well as a pizza supper.”

SINGULARS TV GAME SHOW/DINNER - JUNE 2022

SINGULARS – TV GAME SHOW DINNER - - One Saturday this past June GOCC’s Fellowship Hall was turned into a make-believe television studio during what looked like a 1960’s game show; complete with prizes, quiz categories and timed responses. What was really happening was one of the Singular’s special events; the “TV GAME SHOW DINNER.” This was one of those Singulars events that was opened to couples, too. Leading into the event, the group learned some trivia facts about game shows, such as:

In late 1930’s radio game shows began appearing on U.S. stations

- * In 1938 one of the most popular early radio game shows on network radio was “Information Please”
- * Dr IQ began in 1939 – first big success
- * First licensed game show on TV was “Truth or Consequences” 1941 dreamed up by host Ralph Edwards
- * After World War II, Break the Bank, Stop the Music, and Hit the Jackpot offered contestants a fortune in cash and prizes, which sparked the proliferation of big prize giveaways
- * Daytime TV game shows were lower priced targeting stay-at-home wives; Prime time game shows were generally for higher stakes and included shows like Twenty-One, The \$64,000 Question (1955)
- * Bill Cullen, was the most prolific game show hosts, with 40 game shows during his storied, record-setting career. Other popular hosts include Wink Martindale, Bob Barker, Monty Hall, Merv Griffin, Chuck Barris, Allen Ludden, Peter Marshall, Bob Eubanks, Jack Narz, Gene Rayburn, Richard Dawson and Alex Trebek
- * In the late 1960’s game shows made a comeback with shows like “Jeopardy” (1964), “Let’s Make a deal” (1963), “Wheel of Fortune,” “Password,” “The Dating Game,” and “The Newlywed Game.” During the Singulars event contestants had a chance to answer questions in a variety of categories. Some of the categories included History, Geography, Fashion and Clothing, Medicine and Healing and General Knowledge. Prizes were awarded and everyone who desired had a chance to become a contestant
