"Issachar who understood the Times and knew what to do"

1 Chronicles 12 : 32



Reflections
from Pastor David

The Men Of Issachar

1 Chronicles 12:32 is one of those treasures that we find in a passage that otherwise would not get a lot of attention. This chapter largely details the men from the 12 tribes of Israel that swore loyalty to David when he became king.

It records, "The tribe of Issachar supplied 200 leaders, along with all of their relatives under their command. *They kept up-to-date in their understanding of the times and knew what Israel should do.*" (International Standard Version)

In a time of transition and uncertainty, these men "*kept up-to-date in their understanding of the times and knew what Israel should do.*" That's quite a statement, isn't it?

Our nation is also in a time of transition and uncertainty. The ongoing Covid-19 pandemic and recent political events have added to our concerns. Many of us wonder where we are headed and what the post-Covid-19 world will look like.

The men of Issachar kept up with the times. They seemed to have an unusual sense of what Israel ought to be doing. We are not specifically told the source of their insight – but I believe it was the Holy Spirit.

Do we have a New Testament parallel to their experience? Most definitely! As Jesus prepared his disciples for his departure, he gave them this promise:

"When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own but will tell you what he has heard. He will tell you about the future."

– John 16:13

In a time when many are wondering what will happen next and how we should respond, Jesus offers us the same source of wisdom the men of Issachar possessed. Just as he enabled them to understand the times and know what to do, he can do the same for us.

This would be a good time for us to pray that the Holy Spirit will tell us what he has heard from the Father and show us what to do. If he did it for the men of Issachar, he will do it for us.

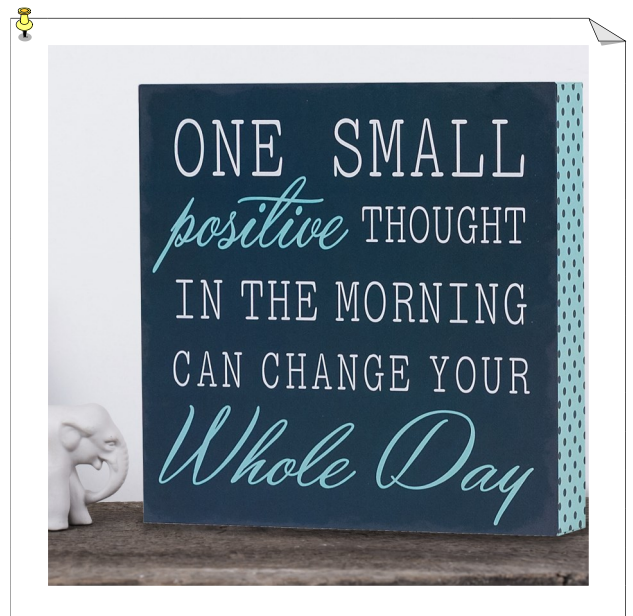

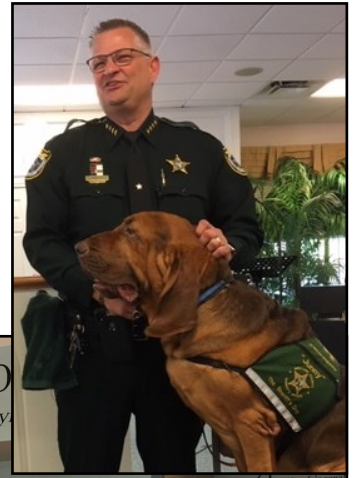
WOMEN IN THE CHURCH

HELPING HANDS MINISTRY

All facets of Helping Hands are **available to anyone in TGO**, not just church attenders. If you have a neighbor who has had surgery and is returning home alone, we can:

- **provide meals for up to 3 weeks,**
- **provide medical equipment to help with rehab**
- **provide transportation to rehab**
- **grocery store, doctor**

If they (or you) need help in rehab, we have a Lending Closet, just call & ask.

- **walkers**
- **wheelchairs**
- **shower chairs, etc.**
- **canes**
- **raised toilet seats**

Our lesser used, but **available handymen to help with "honey do list" items** you can no longer do, especially if it means climbing a ladder.

We also have a baby lending closet with items for visiting grandchildren like:

- **Pack'n Play cribs**
- **walkers, strollers**
- **toys**
- **booster and car seats**
- **high chairs**

Even lesser known, our Respite Care ministry may help caregivers have sitters come in to sit with their loved one so they can go out.

We also help with someone alone coming home from the hospital and needing to be checked in on, or a list of paid caregivers, if necessary.

The last part of our ministry is the County Services Liaison. We are aware of services available in the county that may be of help to you, such as:

Meals on Wheels Free hand holds Installed free ramps built

We are also familiar with Assisted Living and Nursing Homes available in this area, including costs and move in criteria.

MISSION MINUTES

Report from Diana Green:

HOUSE OF HOPE –BRAZIL: They are very grateful for our help in getting their Print Shop started. Since they feel that they are pretty much on their own now, this will be our last year to support them.

ACT-SOUTHEAST ASIA: A media outreach in January, via Facebook is to trying to reach the young people. As the youth respond to the campaign follow up is done personally.

COMPASSION MINITRIES IN PAKISTAN: They are doing a fantastic job in an extremely needy area of the world. This past year they distributed thousands of free Bibles, food and medical supplies to starving families. The government is trying to shut down their churches, but still they continue to win new believers, baptize them and disciple them. They also minister at one the few Bible Institutes.

Report from Wayne Bolton:

AIR MOBILE MINISTRIES-JOE HURSTON: Joe has moved from TGO and has become a North East Tennessee Mountain Man dealing with his cancer. His mission is still based here in Titusville.

Report from Betty Vignali:

GOOD NEWS JAIL/PRISON-JON NIENHUIS: No volunteers have been allowed in the jail due to Covid-19. No Bible Study groups are meeting either, but Jon and Nancy, both Chaplin's, have been doing one-on-one counseling. Jon shared that one of the inmates received Christ as his Savior, never before having the opportunity to hear the gospel. Jon thanks us for our ongoing prayers and financial support.

Report from Lynda Shaw:

PRISON BOOK PROJECT-RAY HALL: They have found a warehouse to move to; but need \$350,000 as a down payment by month end.

Eight hundred dollars in the Prison Book Designated funds was forwarded to them in February. More may follow after consultation with the Missions Committee.

Report from Diane Bomberger:

SAMARITAN'S PURSE: Set up an emergency field hospital in Lancaster, CA for Covid-19 patients. On February 3rd they released the last two patients they had at Lenoir NC, in a 30 bed field hospital.

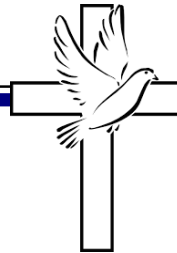
