

Advent: Breaking The Silence



Each Advent season, we re-tell the story of how God sent His Son as Israel's Messiah and the world's Savior. We try to get a glimpse of what that meant – especially for those who longed for God's promises.

Often, we forget that Israel went nearly 400 years without hearing from God. It's called the "Intertestamental Period."

Beginning around 400 B.C., Israel endured a string of brutal oppressions, starting with the Persians and continuing with the Romans. It was such a bloody and tragic time that many of God's people believed Yahweh had rejected them.

One reason for that despondency was the fact that there wasn't a single messenger sent to Israel during the Intertestamental period – not even one.

But then, on a cold winter's night that all changed. The sky lit up over Bethlehem. An angel choir sang. A heavenly messenger brought the first word from God in 400 years. He said,

"I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." – Luke 2:10-12

God had broken his silence. He sent his Son to a world that was mired in darkness and ruled by the iron fist of Rome. The baby born that night brought living proof that God still cared; that He had not forgotten or rejected His people – despite their sins.

This Advent, take that to heart. In a world that seems increasingly mired in darkness, ruled by oppressors, and devoid of the answers to life's challenges, God is still speaking through His Son.

Once again, let's hear what He has to say. Let's do it with fresh ears and open hearts.



Christmas Peace


The Christmas card pictured a snow white dove proclaiming Christmas Peace.

"There's not much peace in the world this Christmas," I sighed. I dropped the card on top of a newspaper whose headlines screamed of "escalating hostilities." It landed beside the photograph of a bomber. By some strange coincidence, I noticed, the outlines of the bird and the bomber were almost identical. Their similarity brought home to me the stark contrast between them. The power of bombs and missiles is frightening. A bird, in contrast, seems frail and insignificant. And yet ...

As I mused on the difference between the two, there came the slow realization that the bird was actually the stronger. True, it could easily be killed by the plane, and was no match to it in speed and size. But it had one thing the plane didn't. It had *life*—precious life! It could grow and multiply in a way that a machine could never do.

"Lord, Your kingdom is like that dove, isn't it?" I asked. "It seems as helpless as ... as a baby nestled in a manger. The bomber is like the kingdoms of this world who, as Herod did, seek His slaughter.

"Now I see what Christmas peace is really all about! It's the assurance You give that some day that "bomber" will come crashing down, and in the midst of the wreckage Your "dove" will build its nest ...



"Oh, Lord, let that happen now in my heart! For too long this world's thunder has drowned Your soft voice. Why have I been living for this world? Lord, I want your Dove to make His nest in the stable of my heart *now*. And I ask that He will also nest in the hearts of those I love. May we all know true Christmas Peace!"
