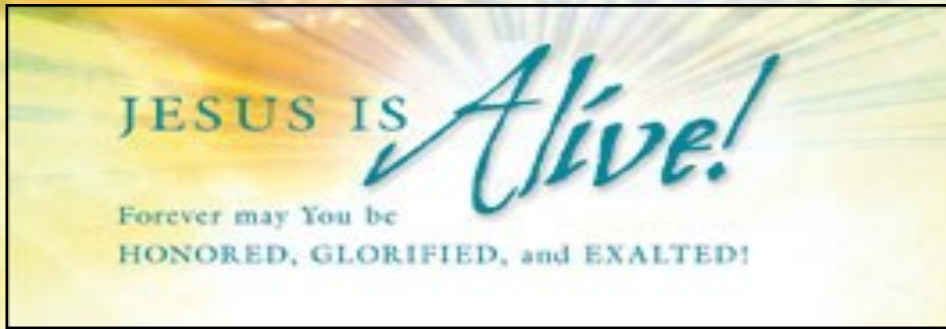

## Reflections

by Pastor David

### He Is Risen Indeed!

There is a story that bears repeating as we approach another celebration of Christ's Resurrection. Given what is happening right now in Ukraine, perhaps it's never been more appropriate.

Nikolai Ivanovich Bukharin was the editor of the Soviet newspaper Pravda, a proponent of the 1917 Bolshevik Revolution and a full member of the Russian Politburo.

In the spring of 1930, Nikolai Bukharin addressed a huge assembly in Kiev. For over an hour he used every argument from Russian Communism to prove God didn't exist and Christianity was a myth.

When he was finished, he stared at the crowd and demanded, "Are there any questions?" Complete silence permeated the auditorium. No one dared to speak.

But then, another Nicolai came to the platform and stood near the communist leader. For some time he surveyed the crowd. Finally his voice reverberated throughout the auditorium as he invoked the ancient greeting of the Russian Orthodox Church:

"CHRIST IS RISEN!"

Suddenly the crowd stood. Their response sounded like thunder:

"HE IS RISEN INDEED!"

This Resurrection season we echo that ancient greeting: "Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!" May we say it with more conviction than ever before!

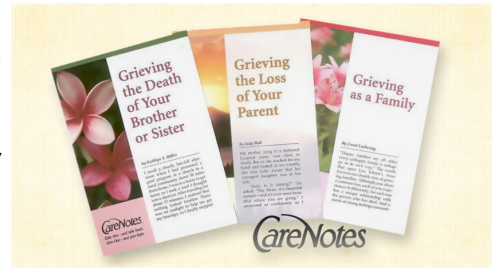

This Christian school offers a quality education to children, kindergarten through eighth grade, promoting high self-esteem, empowering students to become problem solvers and to have a positive impact on their community.

### **\$2,500 Awarded to: Nana's House – Melbourne <http://www.nanaschildrenshome.com>**

Their mission is to provide housing and support for foster families in Brevard county. These foster families care for the **N**eglected, **A**bused, **N**eedy, and **A**bandoned children in our state foster system. Nana's House provides a safe, secure, loving home where children can come and experience God's love and healing.

### **\$5,000 Awarded to: Prison Book Project - Titusville <https://www.nbbd.com/npr/PrisonBooks>**

The largest non-profit Prison Book Ministry in the world - they sending books into prison and jails all across the country and the world. They operate fully on donations and volunteers.

### **\$5,000 Awarded to: Life Recaptured - Merritt Island <https://www.liferecaptured.org>**

Dedicated to eradicating sex trafficking and restoring lives. Life Recaptured provides a Safe Home refuge for survivors of sex trafficking. Florida ranks #3 in the United States for the number of calls reporting cases of Human Trafficking. In the U.S. between 100,000 and 200,000 underage girls and boys are at risk for trafficking into the sex industry. The average age is between 11 and 13 year old. Sex trafficking profits are more than \$150 BILLION(!) per year; the 2nd largest criminal activity (drugs being the largest). Unlike drugs, humans can be sold repeatedly. The emotional, physical and mental trauma of human trafficking victims can take a life time to overcome.

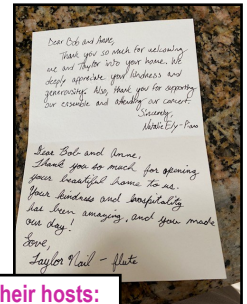

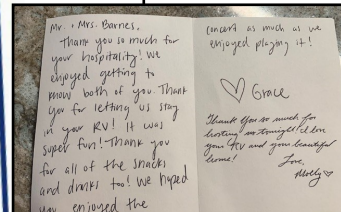

## JOE HURSTON, AIR MOBILE MINISTRY, HEAD TO UKRAINE

Since 2004, our church has been helping Joe Hurston fly life-saving heavy-duty water purifiers to people trapped in war zones and natural disaster areas.

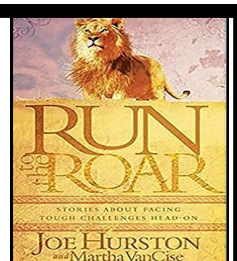
Joe's next goal is Ukraine, where he will deliver ten of these purifiers. The church has released \$3,000 upfront, from his regular monthly support, so he may build one of the purifiers now.

Joe plans to fly commercially to Poland with the purifiers and cross the border from there. His 30-pound purifier uses a filter and ultraviolet light to clean the water where deadly bacteria or chemicals could find the way when water lines have been damaged or turned off for a long period of time. This device can produce up to 25 gallons of pure water every hour, which is enough drinking water for 1,000 people a day. Please pray for Joe's safety, protection and that he will be able to bless the Ukrainian people with clean drinking water.

# MARCH In review
