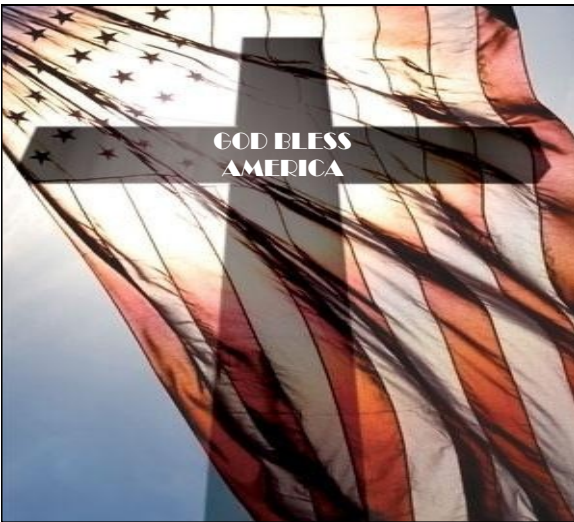

Reflections from our Pastor . . .

Dear Friends

Today our nation watched as our 45th President took the oath of office. It marks the 58th time in our history that a peaceful transfer of power has taken place.

Some might take that for granted. I hope we do not. Regardless of our personal feelings it is an amazing record.

In light of history, very few nations have seen this many moments of political transition without violence and bloodshed. In many parts of the world a transfer of power is reason for genuine fear, not celebration.

One of the reasons America has been able to see so many peaceful transfers of power is because our founding fathers had a profound belief that God ordained all authority.

MISSIONARY FAMILIES GOCC SUPPORT

DAWSON FAMILY – Michael, Keila & Mia (Mission Padamo Aviation)

Michael works as a pilot located Venezuela. His missionary parents worked among the Yanomamo people. He and his wife Keila continue to teach the gospel there. He pours himself into discipleship, Bible study and teaching. Taking missionary trips to other villages he evangelizes, trains and encourages the leaders to carry the message back to their people.



DEVKOTA FAMILY – Akin and Snowy (Baptist International Mission Inc. BIM)

Currently on deputation to raise support to return to Nepal, mid-January they will fly to Nepal for a five week survey trip. Akin born in Nepal, is one of the 300,000 deaf people there. His goal to is share the Good News of Jesus Christ with the deaf people.



EVANS FAMILY-Dan, Erin, Caleb & Audrey (Stride Ministry)

The Evans located at the Hill AFB in Utah mentor young men and women in the, U. S. Military. In their home they teach the word of God, showing God's spirit and associating with the people of God. As they go out into the world where ever the military sends them these young men and women are able to carry the word of God to reach out and disciple others.



CASEY GREEN – (Pioneers, USA)

Casey aims to spend her life counseling and disciplining girls in their relationship to God, to strengthen and embolden them by teaching them sound biblical truth. At time of this Messenger printing her location for her ministry was not indicated.



JAKE & MAGGIE – (Act Beyond)

Due to religious conflicts where they are serving in South East Asia, we are not able to post their last names or exact location. They are a dedicated couple whose goal is to train disciples to make other disciples.

MASIH FAMILY – Perviz & Nasreen (Compassion Ministries)

This family carries God's message to the unreachable Muslim people of Pakistan. Pastoring a home church of over a hundred who live in deep poverty and many have been abandoned by their families. He trains other pastors to carry the word of God back to their villages.



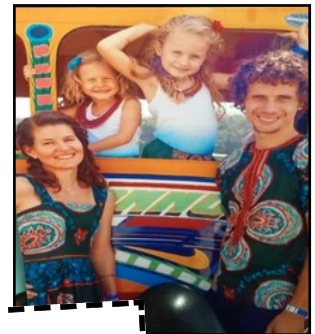
NYSTROM FAMILY –John & Bonnie (Wycliffe Translators)

SHROPSHIRE FAMILY – TJ & Lily children Ava & Penny (NEW TRIBES MISSION)

New Tribes focus is tribal church planting for unreached people groups. The Shropshires are being lead to Senegal West Africa. Their goal is to establish a strong church over a 15 to 20 year period by discipleship, teaching reading and writing, and providing Bibles in their own language.

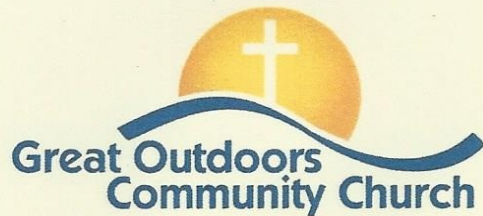
