The Panorama Of Easter

Over the years, Forest Lawn Cemetery in Glendale, California, has gained a lot of attention. Of all things, a cemetery has become a major visitor attraction.

Why on earth would people want to visit a cemetery while they are vacationing in Glendale?

The answer lies in some unique features of Forest Lawn. The first is the number of celebrities that are buried there. The list includes the likes of Lauren Bacall, Humphrey Bogart, Nat King Cole, Clark Gable, Will Rogers, and Elizabeth Taylor.

The second reason is that Forest Lawn has two of the largest paintings in the world. One is a 195' x 45' panoramic painting of the crucifixion displayed in a 600-seat theater called the Hall of Crucifixion-Resurrection.

The other is a 70' x 51' painting of the Resurrection. In it, Christ stands at the left, just beyond the empty tomb. His hands are extended toward a bright vision of innumerable saints of every generation, all indebted to him for their salvation.

That's the Panorama of Easter! On one side of Easter we have Jesus' Crucifixion. As He hangs on the Cross, the sky above Him is wrapped in impenetrable darkness. Little do the spectators know that the fate of the world hangs in the balance.

On the other side of Easter we have Jesus' Resurrection. The darkness of Calvary is replaced by a brilliant sunrise. The depth of the Savior's suffering is replaced by His victory over sin, death, and hell.

No Easter is complete without both events. How beautifully that is expressed in the Daniel Thornton's familiar Easter Hymn, "Up From The Grave". Its author writes:

*Low in the grave He lay
Jesus my Savior!
Waiting the coming day
Jesus my Lord!*

*Up from the grave He arose
With a mighty triumph o'er His foes
He arose a Victor from the dark domain
And He lives forever with His saints to reign*

*He arose!
He arose!
Hallelujah! Christ arose!*

Let those words resonate again in your heart today.

Matthew 11:29, "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart; and you will find rest for your soul."


Dear Heavenly Father,

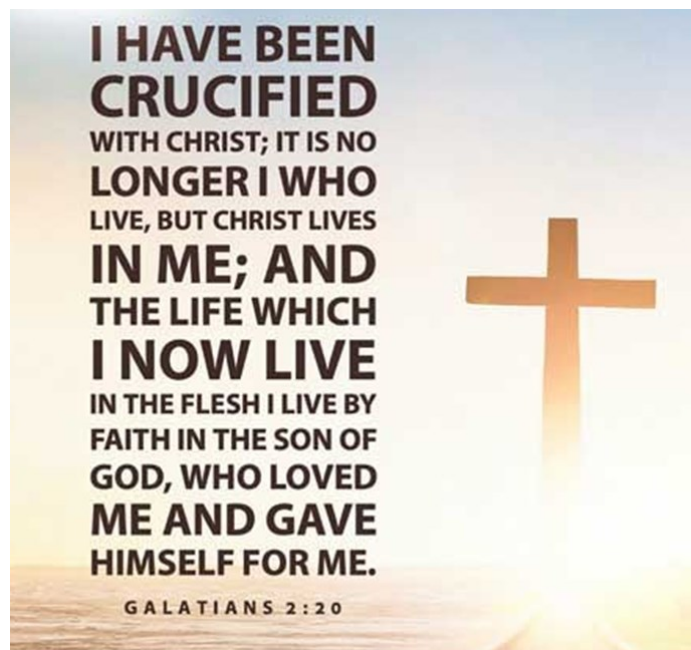

We support some fantastic ministries and amazing missionaries through our missions' program here at the Great Outdoors Community Church. Here are just a few examples.

Joe and Cindy Hurston just returned from a trip to the Middle East where they delivered and deployed 10 water purifiers to Gaza. In the same region, Tass Saada's Hope of Peace Foundation is helping to bring hope in the midst of death, destruction and chaos. They are providing humanitarian aid and emotional support to those most impacted by the war. Here in the U.S., Samaritan's Purse is on the ground responding to devastating tornadoes in Indiana and Ohio.

Every day our missionaries are sharing the gospel and discipling new believers in India, Nepal, Papua New Guinea, Senegal West Africa, Pakistan and Venezuela. As we break for the summer, here's some important ways you can personally get involved in missions right now.

Pray for missionaries.

Here are some urgent prayer needs our missionaries have shared with us:

1. The day after Joe Hurston returned from the Middle East to deliver 10 water purifiers to Gaza, he had knee replacement surgery. Please pray for a complete and speedy recovery for Joe as he has a strong desire to resume flying relief missions to Haiti.
2. Mike Dawson, a missionary to Venezuela that we support, recently had a spot removed from his nose that turned out to be cancer. He is thankful that God miraculously allowed the cancer to be discovered before he was about to return to the jungles of Venezuela for at least a year. Please pray for Mike's recovery and that he will be able to return to the mission field soon, cancer-free.
3. Eagle College, an elementary and middle school we support in Northern Mexico, has seen a rise in violence due to rival drug cartels who have moved into their city. This violence has caused parents to withdraw nearly half of the school's students and has put the remaining students and school staff in danger. Please pray for safety of the students and staff and that the violent cartels will move out of the city.

Give to missionaries.

1. Only three of the ten water purifiers that Joe and Cindy Hurston delivered to Gaza have been funded, meaning that Joe and Cindy covered the cost of the other seven out of their own pockets. The purifiers cost \$3,000 each. If you'd like to help with the cost of these, you can make an online donation here: [Air Mobile Ministries - Water Purifier](#) or by making a designated gift to "Joe Hurston" through the church offering.



2. The Prison Book Project is raising funds to replace the windows of their facility here in Titusville and to purchase Bible and other Christian literature to send to prisons all over the U.S. and beyond. If you'd like to donate to Prison Book Project, you can make an online gift here: [Financial Support | Prison Book Project](#) or by making a designated gift to "Prison Books" through the church offering.

Be a missionary.

On March 21 seven members from our church visited Canaveral Port Ministry in Cape Canaveral. This ministry serves cruise ship crew members by providing free transportation to shopping areas, WIFI, package pickup for online orders, hot meals, chapel services and Bibles in over 70 languages. In 2023, they had over 80,000 crew visits to their center. Multiple volunteer opportunities exist at the ministry, and they are very willing to work with your schedule to make it possible for you to volunteer. They need van drivers, greeters, mail room workers, kitchen workers, store clerks, maintenance, and IT, just to name a few. Joseph told him he would be restored to his position and asked him to speak on his behalf. *That's good.*

Maybe not. The servant forgot about him. *That's bad.*

Maybe not. Pharaoh had dreams that reminded the servant of Joseph. He was brought out of prison and given a high position, which enabled him to save his whole family from famine. *That's encouraging. Everything worked out for the good!* *That's good.*

Maybe not. Their descendants began to follow the gods of Egypt. So a new Pharaoh came to power and enslaved them. *That's bad.*

Maybe not. They grew in number. Their persecution kept them separate from Egyptians and made them strong and prayerful. *That's good.*

Maybe not. Their suffering increased. Pharaoh tried to kill them. *That's bad.*

Maybe not. It made the people willing to follow Moses to the desert where he gave them God's laws and made them a nation. *That's good.*

Maybe not. They continued to follow the gods of Egypt. So they wandered in the wilderness for 40 years and died there. *That's bad.*

Maybe not. It made their children truly ready to follow Joshua into Canaan. *That's good.*

Maybe not. God told them to drive out their enemies, but over time they began to follow their enemies' gods. So they were finally exiled from their land. *That's bad.*

Maybe not. While in exile, they finally learned to hate other gods and repented of their sins. Then they returned to their land. *That's good.*

Maybe not. They grew so legalistic that when the promised Messiah, Jesus, came to them, they rejected Him and had Him crucified. *That's bad.*

Absolutely not. The death of Christ paid for our sins and His resurrection made new life possible for us all. Just as the brothers' rejection of Joseph opened the way for them all to be saved, so rejection by Jesus' Jewish brothers opened the way for all of us, Jews and non-Jews, to be saved forever.

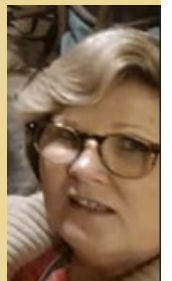
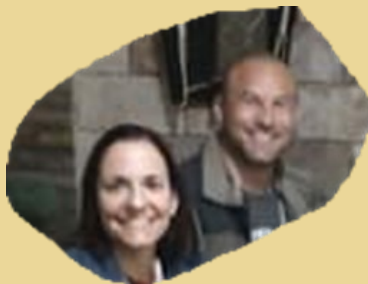
