Reflections from Pastor David



PASSAGES AND BEGINNINGS

I'm sure all of us have experienced the "roller coaster" moments of life.

This past two weeks I officiated two funerals and a wedding. I found myself comforting those grieving and encouraging a couple embarking upon married life in their retirement years. I experienced sadness and loss, as well as joy and hope.

This week reminded of what Solomon had to say about life:

*There is a time for everything,
and a season for every activity under heaven:
a time to be born and a time to die,
a time to plant and a time to uproot,
a time to kill and a time to heal,
a time to tear down and a time to build,
a time to weep and a time to laugh,
a time to mourn and a time to dance,
a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them,
a time to embrace and a time to refrain,
a time to search and a time to give up,
a time to keep and a time to throw away,
a time to tear and a time to mend,
a time to be silent and a time to speak,
a time to love and a time to hate,
a time for war and a time for peace.*

In the more than 2,500 years since Solomon wrote Ecclesiastes, much has not really changed. We attend funerals and we go to weddings. We rejoice in the good times, and sorrow in the difficult ones.

When Solomon surveyed all of the activities of life, he came to one remarkable conclusion. That's what I share with you as I close this article:

**"Have reverence for God, and obey his commands,
because this is all that we were created for."**

Ultimately, our whole lives are anchored in one thing: Our relationship to God. May we find strength in that.

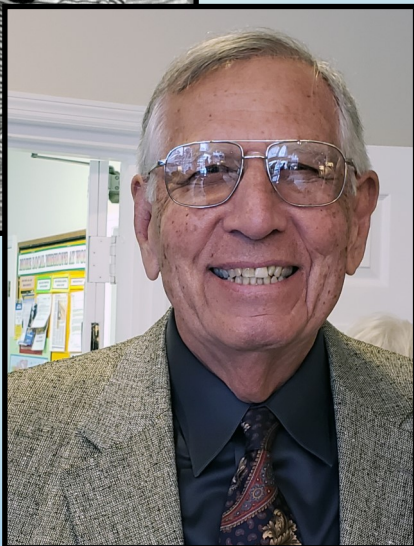

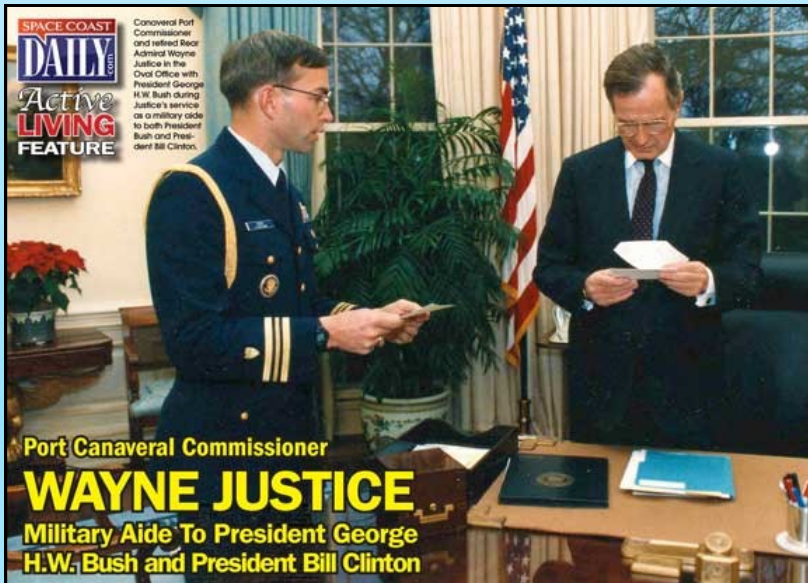

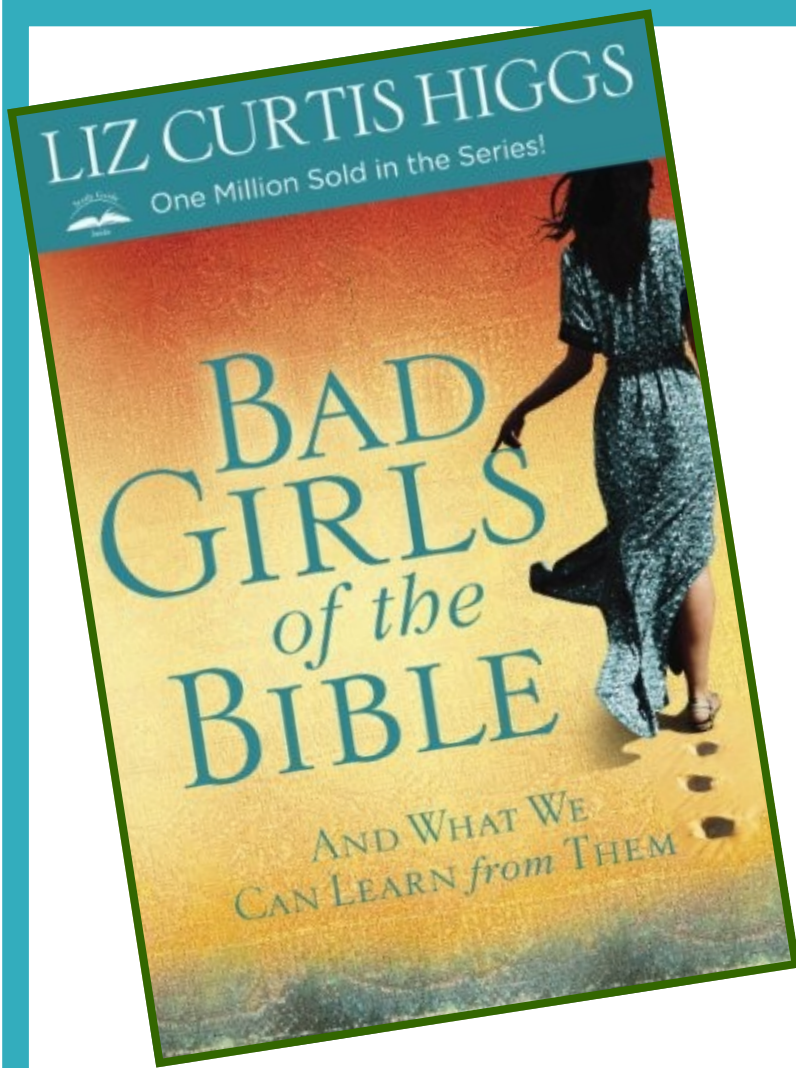
