

PRAYER SHAWL UPDATE

The Prayer Shawl Ministry meets the 2nd Friday of November and December and then the 2nd and 4th Friday from January through April. We have about 12 wonderful volunteers that make our shawls. Our volunteers purchase their own yarn for the shawls; however, we have been blessed many times with donated yarn, funds for yarn and the gift bags for the shawls.

Twice a year approximately twenty shawls are taken to the Cancer Center on Route 1 (many of the patients appreciate the warmth of the shawl during their treatments.) Twelve are taken to the Hospice facility for patients and their families. In December 41 scarves were made for Christian Ministries in Pakistan.

The shawls are kept in the first closet across from the church office. ANYONE who knows of a person in need of a shawl can simply go to the closet and choose a shawl. If a shawl needs to be mailed, the TY -VEK envelope from our mailing facility works perfectly.





Great Outdoors Community Church Missions: SAMARITAN'S PURSE



SAMARITAN'S PURSE is a nondenominational evangelical Christian organization providing spiritual and physical aid to hurting people around the world. Since 1970 it has helped meet needs of people who are victims of war, poverty, natural disasters, disease and famine. The organization served the Church worldwide to promote the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.

May Newsletter from Franklin Graham: Helping Persecuted Christians on the Plains of Nineveh gives us this information.

Easter 2017 Franklin Graham was in Iraq and saw firsthand the destruction and death ISIS has caused in Mosul, the Biblical city of Nineveh. Isis captured Mosul in 2014, and using blaring speakers on mosques order all Christians to leave town in 30 minutes, or else die. Today most Christians are gone from the Plains of Nineveh but bloodshed continues. An **Emergency Field Hospital** that Samari-

tan's Purse operated on the outskirts of Mosul provides expert trauma care along with pray and ministering to each patient in the Name of Jesus.

There used to be 100,000 Christians in vicinity of Mosul, today almost none are left. Many slaughtered, more living as refugees

Dr. Kent Brantly who survived Ebola in 2014 and was featured in moved "Facing Darkness" is part of their team in Iraq.

In the town of Qaraqogh, ISIS burned the church, used the altar for target practice and shot the cross off the ceiling. While walking through the church they found an **Operation Christmas Child shoebox** in the ruins of the church. That shoebox is a reminder of the power and reach of Operation Christmas Child. Over the years Samaritan's Purse and our partners have given out more than a million shoeboxes in Iraq alone and 146 million worldwide. Your shoebox gifts enables Samaritan Purse to take the Gospel to places we could never go otherwise. Over 40% of the patients at our Emergency Field Hospital have been women and children.

PRAYER: Lift up our brothers and sisters across the Middle East who have been forced to flee their homes because of ISIS genocidal attacks on Christians. Ask God to protect and strengthen our partner churches across the region and our medical ministry on the outskirts of Mosul as we work to spread the hope of the Gospel.

The following excerpted articles are from ALONG THE SAMARITAN ROAD, the Samaritan's Purse 2016 Annual Report.

This past year (2016) Samaritan's Purse has helped well over 12 million people in 149 countries and we praise God that we have seen over 1.5 million make life-changing decision to give their hearts to Christ.

The Emergency Field Hospital arrived in Erbil, Iraq on Christmas day aboard a 747-cargo jet that Samaritan's Purse had loaded two days before in Greensboro NC. Within days, the inflatable buildings were erected, two fully equipped operating rooms were open and over 80 doctors, nurses and staff began caring for wounded and sick patients in the name of Jesus Christ.

Samaritan's Purse has handed out truckloads of food staples, cooking kits, and other essentials to meet emergency needs and show God's love to thousands of displaced families in Iraq, Greece and elsewhere.

Families in Mosul often went hungry during the ISIS two year reign of terror, so they are overjoyed to receive sacks of food distributed by Samaritan's Purse in the name of Jesus Christ.

Great Outdoors Community Church Missions: SAMARITAN'S PURSE

Our <u>US Disaster Relief Volunteers</u> helped 3,243 households recover from Hurricane Matthew in the Carolinas, raging wildfires in Tennessee and catastrophic floods in Louisiana, Texas, West Virginia, and Missouri. Through this ministry nearly 900 individuals prayed and accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

Volunteers in Greenbrier County, W. VA., worked tirelessly to gut a flooded house so it could be repaired. After each job was completed, our teams presented a signed Bible to the homeowners.

Hurricane Matthew inundated entire towns in North Carolina and toppled countless trees around homes in South Carolina. But no challenge was too tough for our army of orange-shirted volunteers who began each day circled in prayer.

Hurricane Matthew's 145 mph winds ripped roofs off house in the coastal towns of Jeremie, Haiti. Samaritan's Purse used everything from cargo jets to pack burros to bring help to those who needed it most. The island was battered by waves of misery, being the deadliest Atlantic storm in more than a decade, killing more than 1,600 people as it pinballed across the Caribbean and scoured the coast of four southeastern states. Samaritan's Purse organized daily airlifts of over 9 relief flights on its DC-8 Cargo Jet, to deliver more than 200 tons of emergency supplies to the Caribbean. They also battled an outbreak of cholera that followed the storm. In total 8,000 blankets, 8,000 hygiene kits, 31,756 shelter tarps, and 11,375 water filtration systems were delivered to help storm survivors rebuild their lives.

From Guayaquil, Ecuador, a DC-8 cargo jet took off on its first mission with a self-contained emergency field hospital to treat survivors of a massive April earthquake. Doctors and nurses cared for more than 1,200 patients in the name of Jesus. The DC-8 is a 48-year old refurbished plane than can fly 5,000 miles at 530 mph carrying 30 emergency workers and up to 40 tons of supplies. The DC-8 flew 135,000 miles in 2016, including five missions to Ecuador, four to Liberia, one to Alaska and 10 to Haiti.

In Cambodia, a five-mile irrigation canal was built by Samaritan's Purse in partnership with Greta Van Susteren and her husband John Coale. This enables families to support themselves by raising chickens, pigs and other enterprises, eliminating the need to seek work in Thailand, where they are vulnerable to human trafficking.

In Kenya schoolchildren are helped in raising over 14,000 <u>seedlings</u> to plant groves of fruit trees and reestablish forests.

<u>World Medical Mission</u> placed more than 752 doctors, nurses, dentists and other healthcare professionals on international assignments in 2016 and supported the work of mission hospitals in 34 countries.

A new 46,000 square foot facility was dedicated in October 2016. This <u>new hospital</u> called ELWA (Eternal Love Winning Africa) was built in Liberia. It contains operating rooms, labor and delivery rooms, and emergency rooms, male and female wards, pediatric and obstetric wards, outpatient and infectious disease departments and full lab and imaging departments.

In 2016, The SHOEBOX had a unique opportunity to share the Gospel with nearly 11.5 million children in 104 countries. Samaritan's Purse collect a record 11,486,773 in gifts from 11 different countries, including 9,122,910 from the US since 1991. As a result the SHOEBOX project distributed 146.8 million gift boxes worldwide.

THE GREATEST JOURNEY is raising up a new generation of disciples among the recipients of Operation Christ Child. In 2016, through these classes, more than 1.5 million children have made the decision to accept Jesus Christ as their Savior. In its seven year existence THE GREATEST JOURNEY has brought more than 5 million new believers to Christ. Currently 520,000 volunteers have been trained to lead classes for The Greatest Journey. Upon graduation they are presented with their very own Bible. Bibles are now offered in 70 languages.

<u>CHILDREN'S HEART PROGRAM</u>: in 2016, 50 children from around the world have received lifesaving heart surgery through our Children's Heart Project. Children from foreign countries that need heart surgery are sent by airplane to a hospital in the United States. In the name of Jesus, medical teams have been sent to Liberia and South Sudan to provide cleft lip and palate surgery in for more than 100 children as well as adults.

ALASKA – <u>The Last Frontier</u>: Samaritan's Purse has completed its 26th construction project in remote areas of Alaska. Teams of volunteers embarked into the tundra weekly to work on on-going projects.

<u>HEAL OUR PATRIOTS—Alaska:</u> In 2016, 160 military couples were guests in Alaska. Of these, 79 rededicated their marriages and 67 individuals made commitments to Christ. The ministry gives wounded veterans and their spouses a unique opportunity for spiritual refreshment, physical renewal and marriage enrichment. Couples participate in Biblically based seminars led by retired military chaplains to help strengthen their relationship with God and each other. In the past five years, 686 couples have participated in Operation Heal our Patriots. 306 have rededicated their marriages and 310 individuals have made commitments to Christ.

The Samaritan's Purse Consolidated Statement is available on line at samaritanspurse.org/financial. 2016 Revenues: 60.8% contributions; 38.9% contributed goods and/or services; .03% other income. Expenses: 88.1% ministry; 7.3% fund raising; 4.6% general and administrative.

- 1,519 TNT's (Tablets for National Translators) were distributed in 38 countries in 2016
- 59 BTRK's (Bible Translation Recording Kits) in 38 countries have been distributed and we started translation in 24 unwritten languages in 2016
- 56 POD's (Print on Demand) in 20 countries have been deployed to date

What we do

Since 1987 we have been training local Papua New Guinean church leaders to translate the Bible into their own languages and coaching them through the process from first draft to publication.

We currently serve in the Aitape West Translation Project, which is producing and distributing Bible translations in 11 languages, in print, audio, and video form; training local people to use the translations; and training the local translators to help other translators do the same in even more languages.

In our book, **Sleeping Coconuts**, we have written about how a tsunami changed the face of Bible translation in Papua New Guinea. Wycliffe has released a short film called "Arop" about this amazing story.

Great Outdoors Community Church Missions: WYCLIFFE

AITAPE WEST PACIFIC PAPUA NEW GUINE

The Aitape area is remote and most people are small-scale farmers, growing their own food on their own land. The coastal groups are also known for their beautifully carved canoes.

For typical rural Papua New Guineans, life is dominated by fear of ancestral spirits. The gospel has been preached, but it isn't well understood, even by church leaders. The majority of professing Christians continue to rely on rituals - from ensuring success in gardening, to wooing a potential marriage partner, to healing the sick. Without God's Word in their languages, syncretism is the norm.

Ten teams are collaborating to translate God's Word into their heart languages. The Gospel of Luke was the first portion of Scripture published in most Aitape West languages and it was welcomed enthusiastically by communities who were ready to commit themselves to furthering the work.

Teams continue to equip local citizens to translate God's Word, promote literacy, facilitate Scripture engagement and multiply the translation process with other language communities in the surrounding regions.

GOCC supports Nystroms with \$4,500 a year plus any other designated donations

NEW TRIBE MISSIONS (TJ & LILLY SCHROPSHIRES) has changed its name to ETHONOS 360

Founded in 1942, the name has been changed to better position itself to see a thriving church for every people. Ethnos is the "nations" that Christ referred to in his great commission (Matt. 28:19 and Luke 24:47.) 360 represents the entirety of the globe—all 360 degrees.
