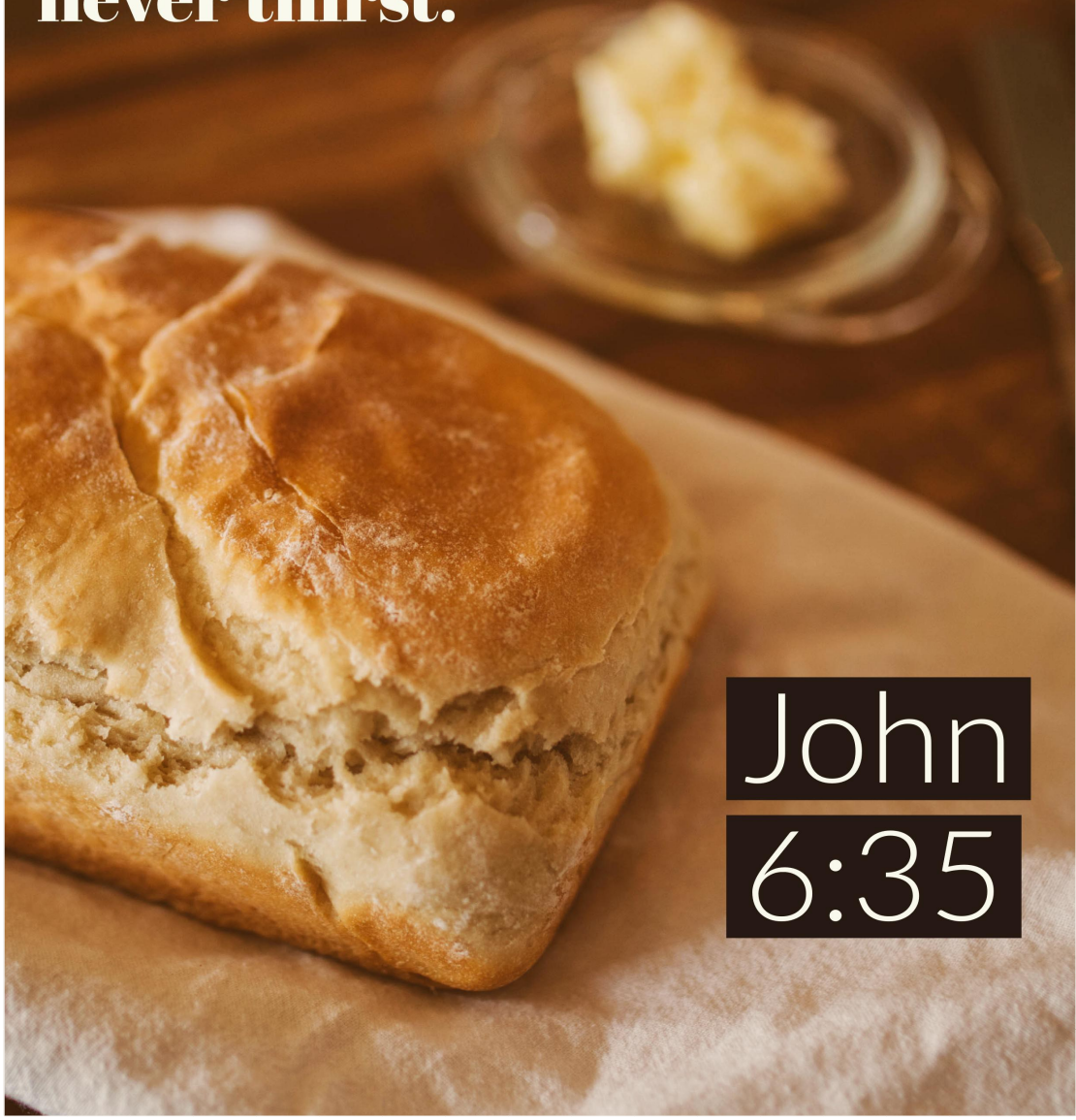

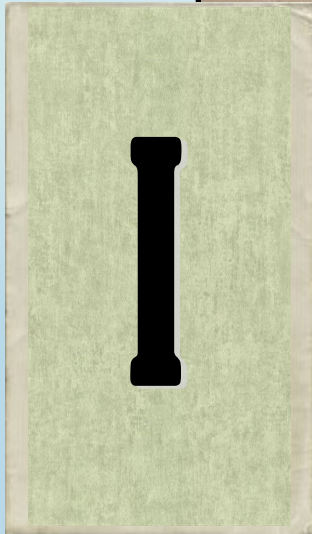
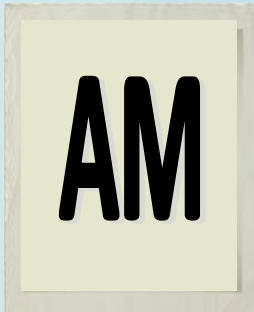

Dear Friend (family, pastor, fellow workers. . .)

Recently I have suffered a devastating loss. I am grieving and it will take months and even years to recover from this loss.

I wanted to let you know that I will cry from time to time. I don't apologize for my tears since they are not a sign of weakness or a lack of faith. They are God's gift to me to express the extent of my loss and they are also a sign that I am recovering.

At times you may see me angry for no apparent reason. Sometimes I'm not sure why. All I know is that my emotions are intense because of my grief. If I don't always make sense to you, please be forgiving and patient with me. And, if I repeat myself again and again, please accept this as normal.

More than anything else, I need your understanding and your presence. You don't always have to know what to say or even say anything if you don't know how to respond. Your presence and a touch or hug lets me know you care. Please don't wait for me to call you since sometimes I am too tired or tearful to do so.

If I tend to withdraw from you, please don't let me do that. I need you to reach out to me for several months.

Pray for me that I would come to see meaning in my loss someday and that I would know God's comfort and love. It does help to let me know that you are praying for me.

If you have experienced a similar type of loss, please feel free to share it with me. It will help rather than cause me to feel worse. And, don't stop sharing if I begin to cry. It's all right, and any tears you express as we talk are alright too.

The loss is so painful, and right now it feels like the worst thing that could ever happen to me. But, I will survive and eventually recover. I cling to that knowledge, even though there have been times when I didn't feel it. I know that I will not always feel as I do now. Laughter and joy will emerge once again someday.

Thank you for caring about me. Thank you for listening and praying. Your concern comforts me and is a gift for which I will always be thankful.

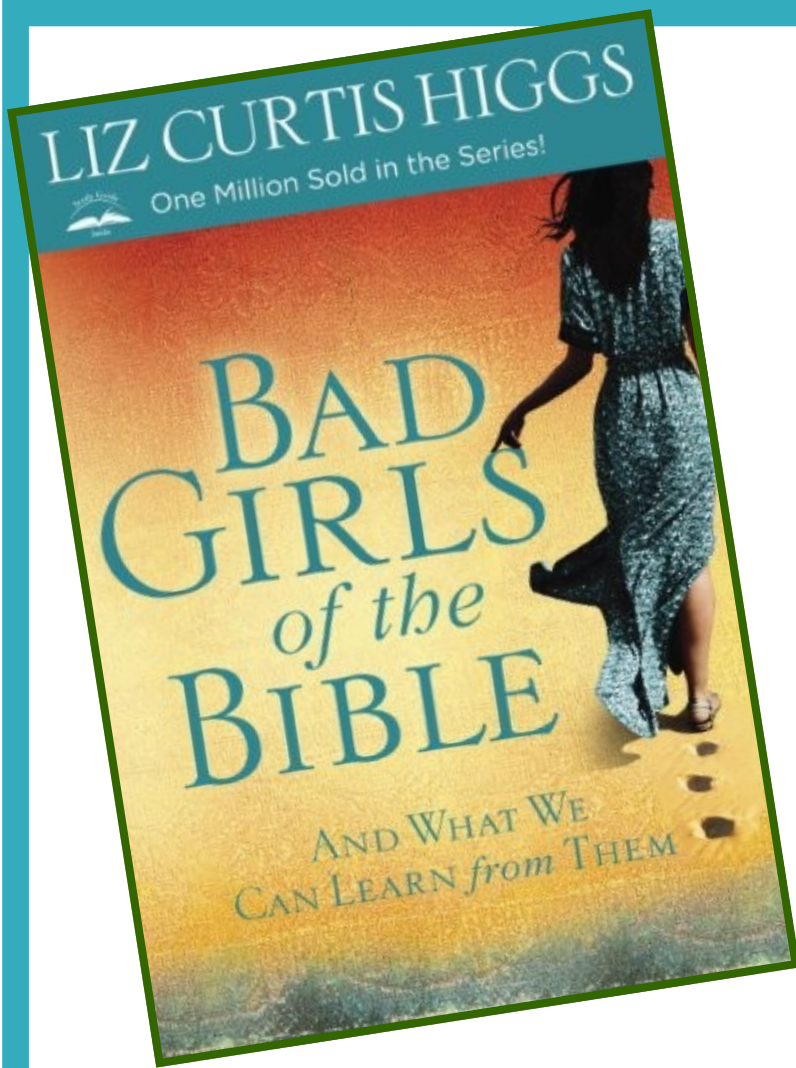

### 2019 – Supporting “Nine” Missionary Families

#### **ACT BEYOND MINISTRY: MAGGIE**

\$350/month = \$4,200.00/ year, plus Designated Fund Donations  
Maggie is serving with Act Beyond Ministries- In South East Asia

#### **BAPTIST INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS, INC. (BIMI) The Devkota Family:**

\$246/month = \$2,952/ year, plus Designated Funds  
Akin was born in Nepal and is one of the nearly 300,000 deaf people; He trained at the Harvest Deaf Bible College where he accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. Their goal is to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with the Deaf people there.

#### **COMPASSION MINISTRIES (NCA): MASIH FAMILY**

\$246/month = \$2,952/ year, plus Designated Funds Donations  
Compassion Ministries carries God's message to the unreachable Muslim people of Pakistan. He pastors a home church of over a hundred people, most of whom live in deep poverty and have been abandoned by their families. He also helps train other native pastors to carry the word of God back to their villages and towns. He and his family face danger daily as they go out to share the Gospel in the midst of many antagonistic people.

#### **COMPASSION MINISTRIES (NCA): RAFIQUE FAMILY**

A family of 6 daughters, they have been in ministry for 13 years with Compassion Ministries.

## *The Boy With No Ears*

By Norman Plunkett, Minister of Education, Chamblee First Church

The message came, "Please pastor, we need you!" The pastor went immediately to the bedside of a new mother. The new father wanted his pastor present when the mother was told that her baby was a healthy, beautiful boy. . .but that he didn't have any ears.

The baby had auditory openings and all the inner ear parts necessary to receive sound. There was, however, no outer fleshy part which is commonly referred to as an ear.

Jimmy's physical problem would be corrected by surgery when his growth was completed and a donor was found. He grew up in an atmosphere of love not realizing that he was different.

One day, Jimmy came running home from school. Weeping, he threw himself on his bed. "They said I was a freak and they laughed

at me!" Jimmy would now be aware of stares, whispers and taunts which thoughtless people direct toward individuals who happen to be different.

One Spring Jimmy received a phone call at college, "We've found a donor, son. The operation will be this summer". Jimmy never believed one could be so proud and happy. His new ears were beautiful!

Graduating with honors, he went to work for an oil company. Many years later, while working in the Mideast, Jimmy received another phone call. "Son, come quickly. Mother is dying".

When he arrived his mother had already passed away. As they looked into the casket, Jimmy's father reached in and brushed the hair away from the side of his mother's head. Mother didn't have any ears!

This moving true story brings us an added dimension to the understanding of God's love. In spite of our unworthiness, God didn't just give us his ears; He gave us His son.
