
You may set up your own appointment time by going to the church website at www.tgochurch.org and clicking on the family picture ("Schedule your photography session").

HOPE FOR KIDS-MEXICO Wish you could view the video recently received from Hope for Kids in Mexico at Eagle College, where we support <u>Cindy Noemi Hermandez Campos</u>; but I did find the words to the song that was played during the video. <u>Jason Gray lyrics for "With Every Act of Love</u>:" About the fifth verse are these lines:

Cyndi, a 9 year old girl (whom we support monthly) at Eagle College in Mexico

Eagle College started in 2007 with 55 students from preschool through 6th grade. The college was born out of the prayers of two local pastors from Ciudad Miguel Aleman and a group of individuals from West Michigan, both whom had a heart for Christian education. The local Templo Belen Church helped get the school off the ground, as they met in their modest facility. However, the walls could not hold them and they soon were turning children away and found themselves in need of a school facility to call their own. Thanks to endless donations, volunteers, and prayers, construction, which began in 2010, is nearing completion.

Eagle College is a private school located on the border town of Ciudad Miguel Aleman, Tamaulipas Mexico, across the border from Roma, Texas. The school is in its 6th year now and is highly acclaimed as one of the top schools in the state. Along with the required curriculum, the students receive knowledge of the English language and an education based on Biblical truths. Many needs still remain to be met. English speaking teachers are needed because of the large influx of students. There will be needs for school supplies and technology to enhance learning. Also, there are numerous projects to still be completed on the new campus. During 2018 we budgeted \$1,200 for the year = \$100 each month.

As the words of the song state:

God put millions of doors in the world for His love to walk through. One of these doors is you.

Thank you so much for allowing the love of God to go through these doors to a school, to a child in Mexico.


