

# Thanksgiving - 1621



As a deeply religious people, the Pilgrims undoubtedly prayed at the 1621 harvest feast. Their prayers were spontaneous, however, and the exact words not known. A typical prayer might be:

*O Lord our God and heavenly Father, which of Thy unspeakable mercy towards us, hast provided meate and drinke for the nourishment of our weake bodies. Grant us peace to use them reverently, as from Thy hands, with thankful hearts: let Thy blessing rest upon these Thy good creatures, to our comfort and sustentation: and grant we humbly beseech Thee, good Lord, that as we doe hunger and thirst for this food of our bodies, so our soules may earnestly long after the food of eternal life, through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour, Amen.*

## Thanksgiving – The Pilgrims' Perspective

Dear Friends,

As I write this month's Reflections article, once again I think back to our nation's rich history. It is filled with stories of people who persevered, despite life's difficulties. As we come to another Thanksgiving holiday, it would be good to remember one of those stories.

On April 5, 1621, a small group of Pilgrims stood on the beach and watched as the Mayflower slowly sailed out of Plymouth harbor for the return trip to England.

Spring was finally emerging after a bitter and disastrous winter. Nothing could have prepared that small band for the harsh realities of building a settlement, while fighting off starvation and sickness.

At the close of that first winter, 50 of the original 102 Mayflower passengers had died. They were buried on Cole's Hill overlooking Plymouth Harbor.

It's remarkable that none of the Pilgrims decided to board the Mayflower and return to England that spring day in 1621. Instead, they decided to stay in the wilderness and continue their New World experiment.

Their story reminds us of what Hebrews 11:15 says about the heroes of faith: "If they had longed for the country they came from, they could have gone back."

That fall, Governor William Bradford announced a time of celebration thanking God for his blessings. The Pilgrims invited the Wampanoag Indians to join them. They owed them a great debt for helping them plant life-sustaining crops that previous spring.

400 years later, our nation that sprang from that small band of Pilgrims is again facing numerous challenges. Our New World experiment seems to be in jeopardy.

This Thanksgiving let's remember the Puritan's example of perseverance. Let's seek the same Savior they trusted and committed their very survival to.

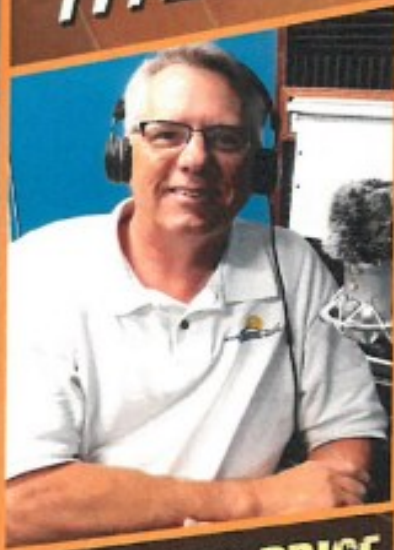

### HELPING HANDS MINISTRY

All facets of Helping Hands are **available to anyone in TGO**, not just church attenders. If you have a neighbor who has had surgery and is returning home alone, we can:

- **provide meals for up to 3 weeks,**
- **provide medical equipment to help with rehab**
- **provide transportation to rehab**
- **grocery store, doctor**

If they (or you) need help in rehab, we have a Lending Closet, just call & ask.

- **walkers**
- **wheelchairs**
- **shower chairs, etc.**
- **canes**
- **raised toilet seats**

Our lesser used, but **available handymen to help with “honey do list” items** you can no longer do, especially if it means climbing a ladder.

We also have a baby lending closet with items for visiting grandchildren like:

- **Pack’n Play cribs**
- **walkers, strollers**
- **toys**
- **booster and car seats**
- **high chairs**

Even lesser known, our Respite Care ministry may help caregivers have sitters come in to sit with their loved one so they can go out.

We also help with someone alone coming home from the hospital and needing to be checked in on, or a list of paid caregivers, if necessary.

The last part of our ministry is the County Services Liaison. We are aware of services available in the county that may be of help to you, such as:

**Meals on Wheels      Free hand holds      Installed free ramps built**

We are also familiar with Assisted Living and Nursing Homes available in this area, including costs and move in criteria.

The Helping Hands Ministry needs a person who is service-minded and willing to administer our Respite Sitting program for caregivers.

- ◆ This program provides sitters for a loved one - when the caregiver has to do errands or go to an appointment for a couple of hours;
- ◆ The sitters do not give any care, but are there to make sure the loved one is safe
- ◆ The administrator does not need to be a sitter, but will keep a list of those available to sit and call them when needed
- ◆ They will also recruit more sitters as needed
- ◆ Generally, once a year (in January) we have a table during coffee hour where we recruit in general, for all aspects of the ministry

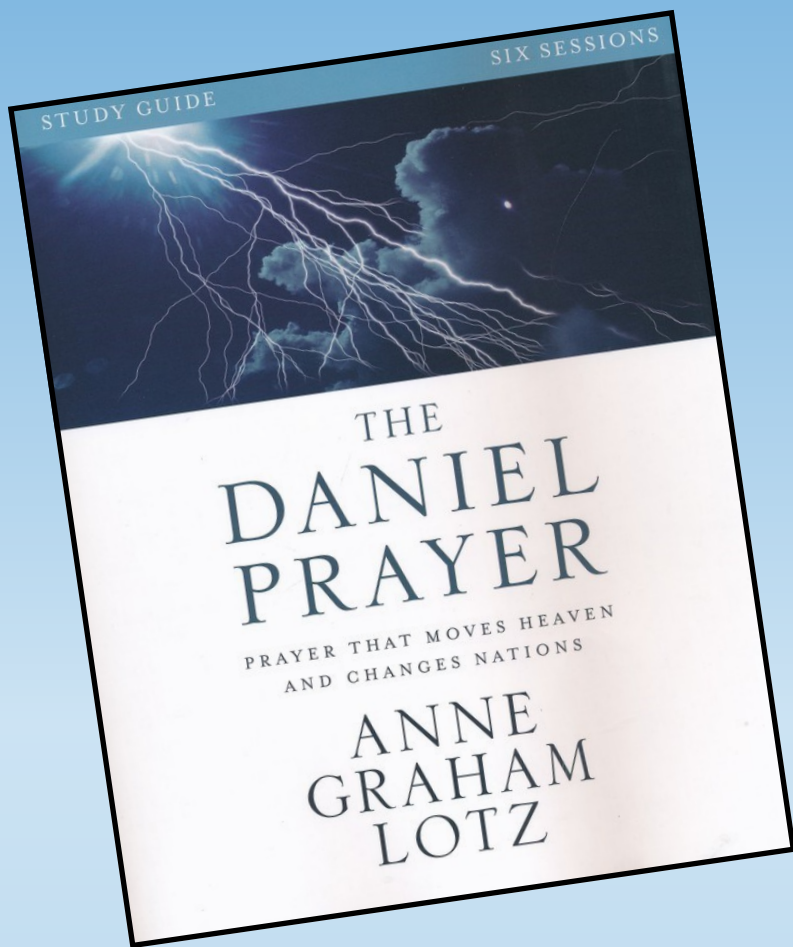

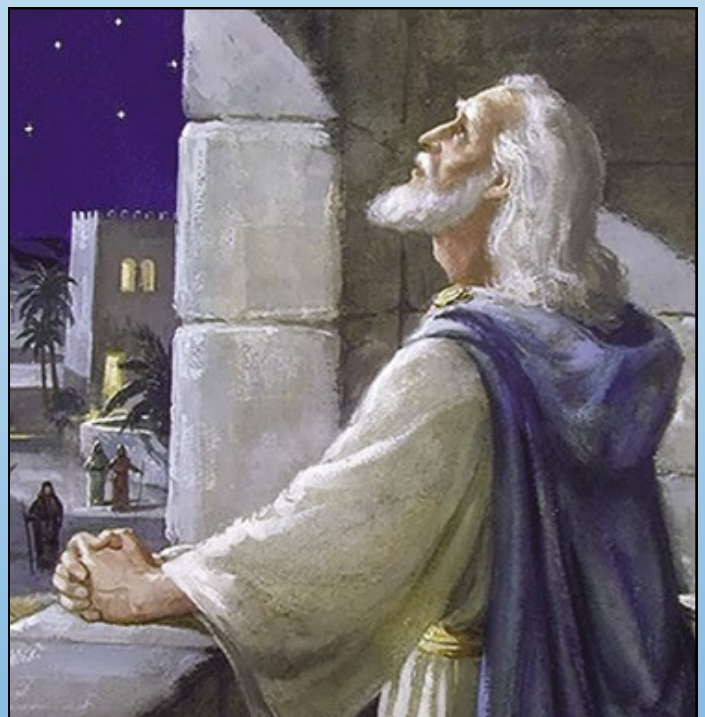

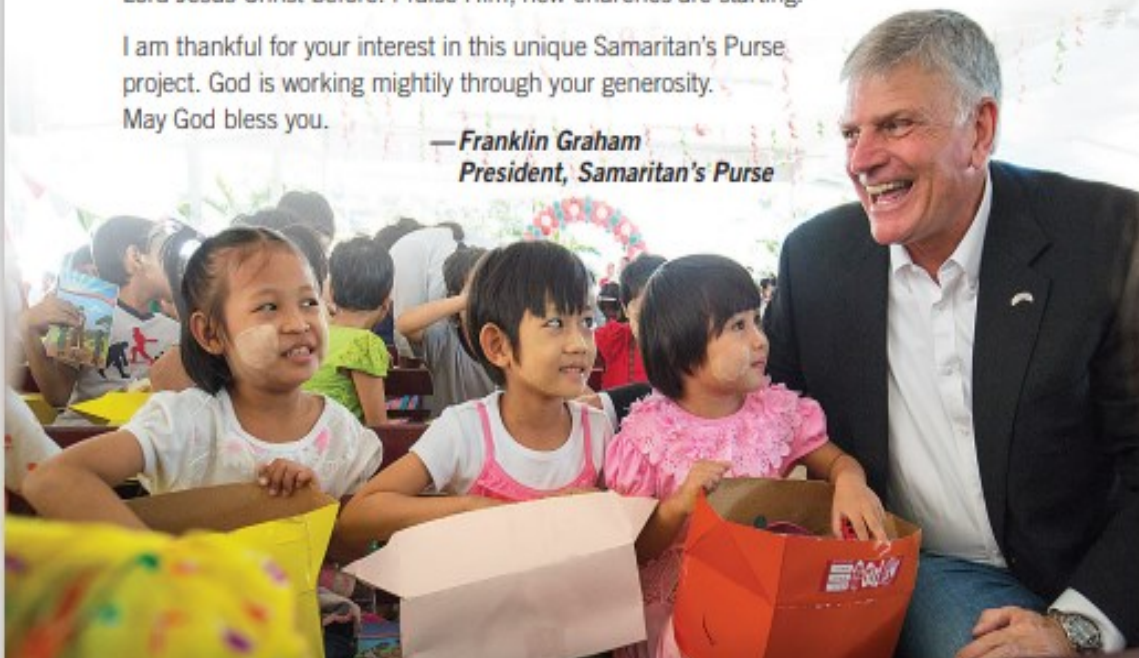
