November 2023

## from Pastor David

### Reflections – November 2023

As we approach Thanksgiving, I share an old story, but one that I think is well worth repeating, because it has lasting relevance. It's a story of giving thanks to God no matter what is happening in our lives.

Martin Rinkart was a 17<sup>th</sup>-century Lutheran pastor in the village of Eilenburg, Saxony. He began his ministry during a brutal time in European history called the "Thirty-Years' War."

The "Thirty-Years' War" (1618 to 1648) was one of Europe's longest and most brutal wars in human history, resulting in more than 8 million casualties as well as widespread famine and disease.

Throughout this period, thousands of people fled to the walled city of Eilenburg, attempting to avoid both plague and famine. At one point, so many were dying that Martin Rinkart was doing fifty funerals a day.

We can only imagine how difficult it must have been for Pastor Rinkart to be surrounded by death, grief, and mourning on a daily basis. Yet, it was during that time he penned one of our most enduring Thanksgiving hymns.

We know the words by heart:

*"Now thank we all our God,  
with heart and hands and voices,  
Who wondrous things hath done,  
in whom this world rejoices.  
Who from our mother's arms  
hath blessed on our way,  
With countless gifts of love,  
and still is our today."*

From year to year, the Thanksgiving "season" may include a mixture of good and bad experiences. Rinkart's hymn, written during the worst of times, reminds us that we can still give God thanks. We can still remember His "countless gifts of love." We can still be convinced that God is at the center of our lives.

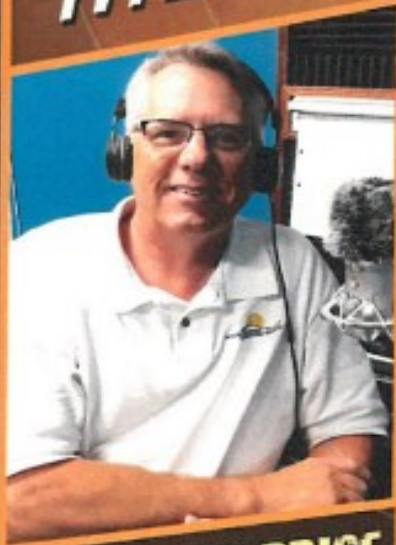

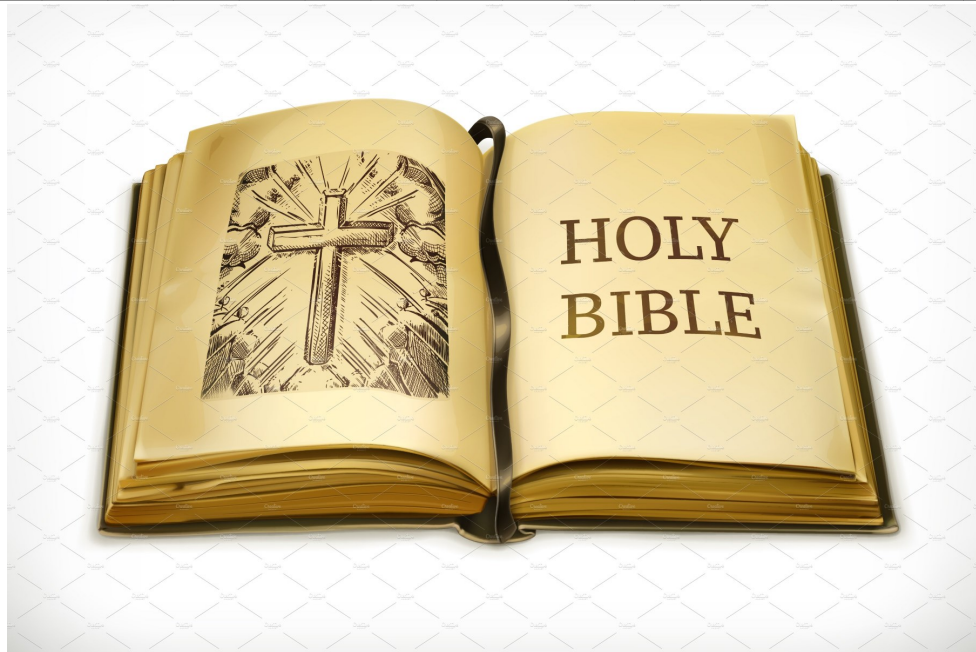

It is important to sign up on Sunday or in the church office during the week to indicate what specific dish you will bring to share. "This will help give us an accurate count, so we know how much food to prepare," says Pam Bolton, Singlars sponsor.

**DO YOU KNOW WHO I AM?**

Wife of Elimelech and the mother of Mahlon and Chilion. A member of Judah's tribe, she lived in Bethlehem during the period of the judges. Her story is told in the book of Ruth. Because of a severe famine in Canaan, she temporarily re-settled with her family in the land of Moab, east of the Dead Sea (Ru 1:1-2). Following the death of her husband and two sons in Moab (vv3-5) she returned to Bethlehem with her Moabite daughter-in-law (vv8-22). Upon meeting her friends, she told them to call her Mara, meaning "bitter" because she said, "I went away full, but the Lord has brought me home empty" (vv20-21). Her domestic problems were eventually resolved when her daughter-in-law married Boaz, Elimelech's near kin (chs 2-4).

## Memory Garden Columbarium



The Columbarium of Great Outdoors Community Church is located in the Memory Garden alongside the church. Columbaria are structures where cremated remains are placed in urns within niches for permanent remembrance. The peaceful setting of the garden provides a welcome place for prayerful meditation and for remembering and honoring loved ones.

The Columbarium is open to current or past members of Great Outdoors Community Church and members of their immediate family. Residents of The Great Outdoors Community are also eligible, as are others who may have lived at The Great Outdoors Premier RV/Golf Resort.

The fee for a columbarium niche (the right of inurnment) includes a niche, two (2) urns, all costs directly associated with inurnment, including opening and closing of the columbarium, and cost of inscription of names and dates.
