In January of 2020, the first confirmed cases of Covid-19 were reported in the United States. Since that time, all of America has experienced a "bumpy ride."

As I write these words, we are "gearing up" for the fall season at GOCC. Let me share an outline of our plans:

- **Sunday Services:** At this point, we are just starting to see a rise in the Sunday morning in-person attendance. For now, we are going to continue with one service at 10:00 a.m. We will monitor attendance and add a second, earlier service, when it becomes necessary.
- **Sunday Fellowship Time:** On Sunday, October 3, we will return to our fellowship time following the 10:00 a.m. service. To begin, we will limit ourselves to coffee/tea. This is for everyone's safety. We invite everyone to join us.
- **Channel 732**: Sunday, September 26<sup>th</sup>, will be the last of the Sunday morning CCTV broadcasts on channel 732. If you are not able to attend our services in person, we offer livestreaming at <u>www.tgochurch.org</u>.

We owe thanks to the CSA for allowing us to "piggyback" on their system and to Ray Lee for donating a great deal of his personal time to monitor the system at the Manor each Sunday morning.

- **Livestreaming:** We will continue to Livestream the Sunday services at 10:00 a.m. We are using three different platforms, so we have "back-up" in case one is not working. You can see the livestream by going to our church website, <u>www.tgochurch.org</u>.
- **Resuming Our Ministries:** We are planning to resume our full slate of ministries and committees this fall. If you have any questions about your specific ministry, please contact your group leader.

I am looking forward to seeing all of you as the weeks progress. We are praying for a very productive season of ministry.
