“Reflections” from Pastor David

The Jeremiah 29 Life



Jeremiah 29:11 is a favorite passage for many. It says, “For I know the plans I have for you,” declares the Lord, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.” Do you know the historical context of that passage? The Israelites had recently been forced into exile in Babylon when God prompted Jeremiah to send them a letter. They were in the last place they ever wanted to be, but God had some encouraging things to say to them:

Settle there and build houses. Plant gardens and eat what you grow in them. Get married and have children, then help your sons find wives and help your daughters find husbands, so they can have children as well. I want your numbers to grow, not to get smaller. Pray for peace in Babylonia and work hard to make it prosperous. The more successful that nation is, the better off you will be.

Because this remnant was going to be in Babylon for seven decades, God encourages them to do three things:

Keep Living A Full Life

It would have been easy for these captives to lose the will to live – to give up any opportunities for happiness. God tells them to do just the opposite. He tells them that, even if Babylon is not a desirable place to be, they should keep living a full life.

That’s good advice for us as well. 2021 has been a difficult year. Covid 19 has changed America in some previously unthought of ways. Perhaps it has affected your life in a personal way.

In tough times, it’s easy to feel like giving up. God gives his people in exile a list of things to keep doing so they can have a full live. He tells them to “plant, eat, get married, have children, help your sons and daughters find spouses.”

Pray For The Nation’s Prosperity

Even though they are living in a foreign land God tells his people to pray for Babylon’s prosperity. He tells them why this is important. He says, “Pray to the Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper.”

At times, we may find ourselves at odds with our nation and the direction it is heading. That was certainly the case for God’s people in Babylon, but God reminds them that their personal peace and prosperity depended on the peace and prosperity of Babylon.

As we come into 2022, let’s keep that in mind. There is nothing good that will come from us cursing our nation or its leadership. We need to pray that our nation so that, as the New Testament puts it, “We can live our lives in peace.”

This year let’s commit ourselves to pray for America and its leaders.

Trust God’s Long-Term Plan

In a unique turn of events, God told his people how long they would be in Babylon. He fixed the timeframe at 70 years. That’s a long time by anyone’s standards, but there was something hopeful in that prediction.

At the end of 70 years God promised to bring the captives back to the land of Israel. The captivity wasn’t open-ended. And when they returned God promised he would once again bless Israel and Judah.

God promised them: “When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will come to you and fulfill my good promise to bring you back to this place. For I know the plans I have for you,” declares the Lord, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. – Jeremiah 29:10-12

There’s the context for one of our favorite verses. It would be 70 years before their release. In the meantime, they were to trust God’s long-term plan. If he had a plan for them, he has a plan for us as well.

Our deliverance might not always come quickly. When will the Covid pandemic be over? When will the economy return to a prosperous level? We don’t know, but we can trust that God has a long-term plan for us.

Do you remember what Joseph told his brothers about all the difficult things that had happened to him? He said, “You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives.” – Genesis 50:21

Joseph was telling his brothers, “You had a short-term plan, but God had a long-term plan.”

In 2022, let’s hang onto that thought. No matter what comes our way, God has a long-term plan. Nothing that happens to us can derail what God intends! God gave him people three keys for their new life in Babylon:

- Keep Living A Full Life
- Pray For The Nation’s Prosperity
- Trust God’s Long-Term Plan

That’s good advice for us as we start 2022.

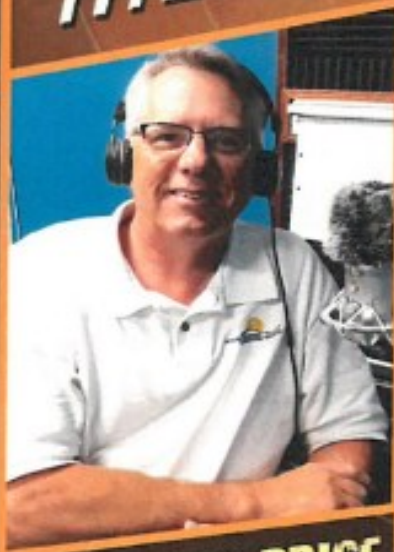

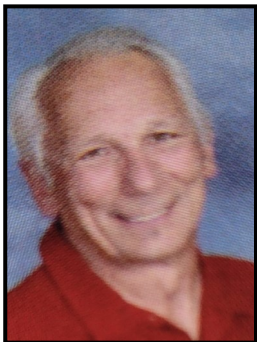

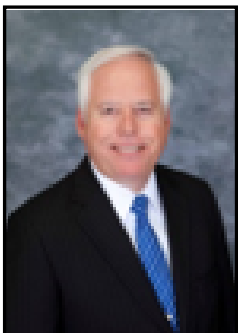

As most of you know, the Great Outdoors Community Church, along with WIC and the Legacy Fund have helped give moral and monetary support to Nana's House over the years.

Located in West Melbourne, *NANA's House* offers children a place where they will genuinely experience God's love. These children often come to *NANA's House* with a hard or hurting heart, depending on the length and degree of abuse they have suffered. Healing takes place in the heart... then the mind can be transformed. They are loved by the staff and house parents, and they demonstrate their worth and purpose in the eyes of their Creator.

NANA's House provide resources to help the foster family with whatever the child may need. They have built a Gated Community on 7 acres of property with a community building, swimming pool, and a playground in a lovely, wooded setting. They currently have eight homes, housing 5 children and 2 house parents each, and provide all utilities, and transportation necessary for the foster families, living in our Nana's House homes!

Nana's House is absolutely amazing. Everyone is a volunteer, so all funds go directly to the care of our communities needy, abandoned, and abused children. This is truly the most amazing place with the most amazing people. Hearts of Gold, serving our community with abounding love and compassion.

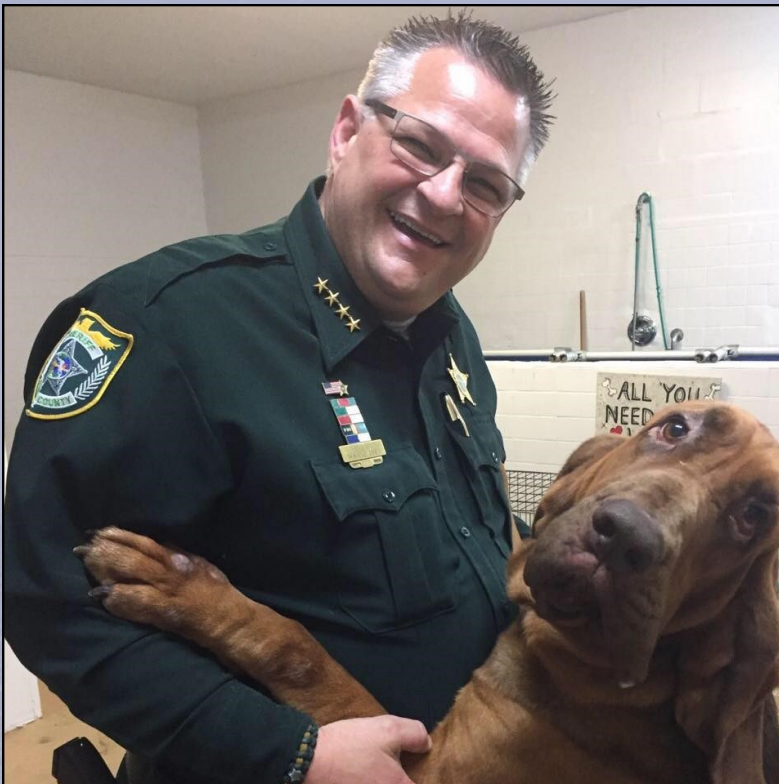

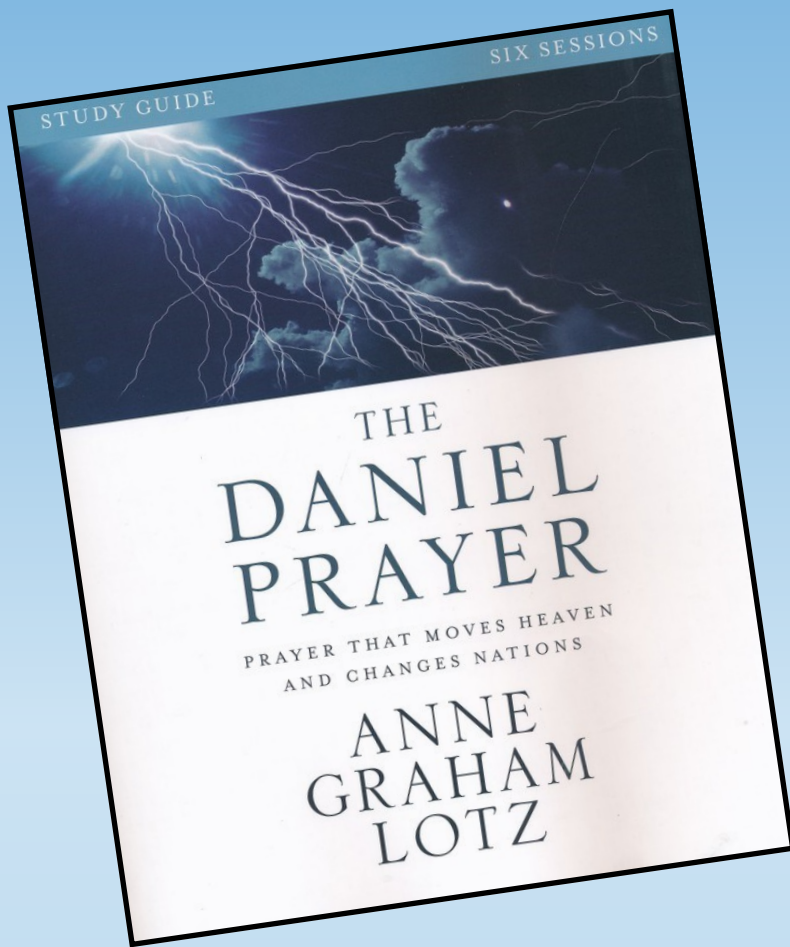

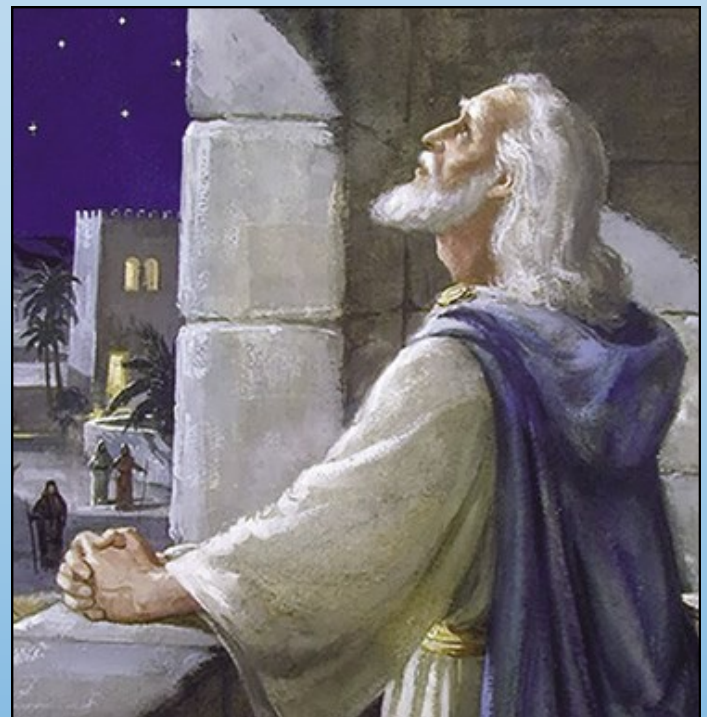

Maggie The Missions Team had a delightful and informative visit on December 16th from our missionary Maggie, who ministers to Muslims in a far-east country with Act Beyond. She and her missionary partner are gently but determinedly reaching out in every way they can. She asked us, "Pray for the media outreach as we launch a campaign in January through Facebook. The young people in our country spend 5 hours a day on their phones reading or listening to whatever is on the internet. This is the wave of the future. We will contact each of those who respond to our campaign and will follow up with them personally. We very much need 2 or more fulltime Muslim-background believers to spearhead this media effort—especially one who is a technology expert."

Also the Bible translation in the language of these people is in its final stages. It is very difficult to find native speakers who are brave enough to help check it so it can be published. Pray that the translators will find just the right ones.

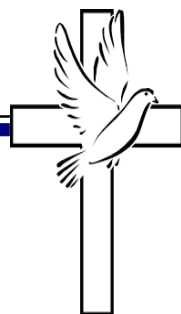
