BET YOU DIDN'T KNOW!

- 1. Saint Patrick was born in <u>Britain</u>, circa 387AD and died 17 March 461AD.
- 2. At age 16 he was kidnapped by Irish pirates and sold as a slave to a Celtic priest in Northern Ireland.
- 3. After 6 years of enslavement, he escaped back to Britain.
- 4. Patrick came to view his enslavement as God's test of his faith, and he became deeply devoted to Christianity, through constant prayer. In a vision, he saw the children of pagan Ireland reaching out their hands to him. He grew increasingly determined to convert the Irish to Christianity.
- 5. Instead of attempting to eradicate native Irish beliefs, Patrick chose to incorporate their traditional rituals. He superimposed a sun, a powerful Irish symbol, onto the Christian cross to create what is now called a Celtic cross. He also used bonfires to celebrate Easter, since the Irish were used to honoring their gods with fire.
- 6. The shamrock, the symbol of Ireland, can also be directly attributed to St. Patrick. It is said he used the shamrock as a visual guide when explaining the Holy Trinity.

THE STORY OF ONE "SHELTER IN PLACE" CONNECTION GROUP

In the early days of the Coronavirus pandemic, it was not possible for small, Connections Groups to meet in person for fellowship, but there was still an interest in and a need for close fellowship. So, it was decided, in early April of 2020, that a group would form remotely, calling themselves a "Shelter In Place" Connection group.

At first, the group used a conference call format that linked everyone up by voice - it had its challenges, especially at first, as people had to learn how to take turns and not talk at the same time. A format that focused on getting to know one another, prayer together with a little recorded music and discussion of that Sunday's sermon was decided on. Too, there was a lot of laughter and good humor. Soon, the group of 5 couples and one single was off and running.

Not too long after forming, the group decided to add the use of the "Zoom" technology to the weekly meeting, so participants could see one another as well as hear each other. Some were skeptical that this would work (or that they could master the technology to participate), but it DID, and a new dimension was added to the group's interaction and, by all accounts, it functions almost as good as a real, face-to-face Connection group: after all, we were meeting in our homes, in informal dress and with the same "getting to know you" culture that goes along with GOCC's "Connecting People to God and to one another" approach.

Over the next two years, couples and individuals have, for a variety of reasons, come and gone. But a core group has remained and prospered together. That doesn't mean there hasn't been sickness, family challenges, and difficulties but the group has been there for one another and that has made a BIG difference. Led by Shirley and J.B. Kump the group currently has six couples and one single. "It is our plan for several of the group members to start other Connection Groups of their own soon," says Kump. "We will never be totally disbanded, even though we may not meet on a weekly basis eventually, but we want others to experience the same fun and fellowship we have enjoyed, and the only way that can happen is if we spread the concept by forming new groups."

In recent weeks there have been some opportunities for the group to gather together with each other, faceto-face but the weekly meetings are still, for the most part, over the zoom connection. "That makes things easier when some of our members have to be up North," says Pastor Kump. "We see a different background sometimes in people's homes, but we are still able to connect, and that's important."

"It is our plan for several of the group members to start other Connection Groups of their own soon," says Kump. "We will never be totally disbanded, even though we may not meet on a weekly basis eventually, but we want others to experience the same fun and fellowship we have enjoyed, and the only way that can happen s if we spread the concept by forming new groups."

But a simple desire to donate a few good books to help prisoners led him into starting what has grown to be the largest Prison Book Project in the world.

Publishing companies now ship them truckloads of new books which they then prepare and send on to over 2,700 prisons and jails around the country and into Canada and Mexico. In the last 27 years, many thousands of lives have been touched and changed forever through this ministry.

Last year they received over 11,000 letters of grateful thanks.

GOCC has had the privilege of supporting this work, not only financially but through the many members who have actively taken part in stamping and shipping all those books.

Now that Ray got to see his dream of acquiring a decent building (just last year!) the work will be going full steam ahead, led by the Prison Book Project board and Ray's hardworking wife Joyce, along with many volunteers who have been very inspired by all those letters.

They need more volunteers. Maybe you.?!
