Thanksgiving, our national holiday is not far off again.

I marvel how revisionist historians are attempting to rewrite American history in such a way to insist our founding fathers weren't interested in God or spreading the Gospel.

Nothing could be further from the truth. History records that God was the very focal point of our Founding Father's New World adventure. Consider this:

In 1620 one hundred and two people crossed the Atlantic in a sailboat that was twenty-six feet wide by one hundred and thirteen feet long.

As they stepped off the boat in the bitter cold of winter they signed a community pledge that has these words in the second paragraph: "... For the Glory of God and advancement of the Christian Faith."

Only fifty-eight of original colonists survived the first winter. When they gathered their first harvest, they marched through the cornfields singing, *"The earth is the Lord's and fullness thereof, the world and they that dwell therein!"*

On December 13, 1621 they marked the first "Thanksgiving" along with eighty Native American friends.

Few modern textbooks tell what happened next: The first "Thanksgiving" consisted of three days of preaching, praying, singing, and eating!

Three hundred and ninety two years later, let's follow in the footsteps of those spiritual and physical Pilgrims. Let's mark Thanksgiving with a song of praise and a prayer of gratitude to our loving God.

The psalmist had it right: "Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD."

The Common Bonds of Caregiving

This article speaks for all caregivers and poignantly expresses the feelings each of us carry with us daily. It is something you might consider sharing with your family and friends.

What is caregiving and how do you define a family caregiver? What is the common thread that ties together those of us who care for spouses, children, parents, siblings, partners or friends who are chronically ill, frail, or disabled?

It certainly isn't the tasks of caregiving. They vary so much, from situation to situation.

It surely isn't the number of years involved. Caregiving can last a few short months. It can last three to five years. At times, caregiving is a lifetime commitment.

Location of caregiving varies from situation to situation. Although most caregiving goes on in the home, and most caregivers and recipients live under the same roof, talk to anyone whose parent is in a nursing home and you'll quickly learn that caregiving doesn't end when someone else is responsible for day to day care, or when caregiving takes place long distance.

If it isn't the responsibilities or tasks, and it is not the length of time or the location - what is the essential bond of caregiving? What does caring for a spouse with Parkinson's disease have to do with caring for parents who are losing their independence, or a child with epilepsy?

In 1994, when the National Family Caregivers Association (NFCA) conducted its first caregiver member survey, we were seeking to find that common bond, to define the link between all caregivers. We found in no uncertain terms that the common bond of caregiving is its emotional impact.

The common bond of caregiving is the *intense sadness* we feel because someone we care about has perhaps suffered a brain injury or is losing their mobility and will never achieve normal life functioning. It is the sadness that comes from wanting the miracle of normalcy.

The common bond of caregiving is *the upheaval of changing family* dynamics that occurs because life has been turned upside down and because there is no set timetable for working through the painful stages of grief which caregivers and care receivers all experience in their own personal and private way.

The common bond of caregiving is the *sense of isolation* that comes from living outside the norm, from having everyday activities of life - dressing, walking, toileting, thinking clearly -- that everyone else takes for granted, become such a big focus in your own life.

The common bond of caregiving is *the frustration* we all experience because it is so hard to get things done, because non -caregivers just don't understand, because healthy people park in handicapped parking spots, and because people who are supposed to have the answers often don't.

The common bond of caregiving is *the stress* we feel because we don't have enough leisure or personal time, and the common bond of caregiving is unfortunately often the severe depression that so many of us suffer.

These are the common bonds of caregiving that tie us to one and other, that develop in us an innate understanding of

GOOD NEWS CLUBS "NEWS"

Praise the Lord! Good News Clubs have started at Coquina Elementary and Oak Park Elementary. The children are excited about coming back after a long summer and so are the volunteers.

A challenge has come up this fall regarding all the Good News Clubs. The county has made the decision to charge us a weekly fee for the rooms we use at the school for Clubs. In previous years room usage was free. The fee varies depending on the size of the classroom used, with some estimates at \$50 a week. Unfortunately, none of the churches budgeted for such a fee (churches didn't know they were going to be charged when church yearly budgets were put together). We are happy that two of our Clubs did open, but we ask your prayers for the Mims Elementary Club. The Mims sponsoring church is considering this additional charge and once a decision is made we hope to open this Club shortly thereafter.

Additional volunteers are greatly needed at the Oak Park (Wednesday) and Mims (Tuesday) Clubs. If you have a love for children we could really use you in this ministry. If you would like to volunteer please contact me at 321-385-1130.

In last month's Newsletter I spoke about a survey conducted in April of 2013 by Child Evangelism Fellowship® among principals of public elementary schools that host a Good News Club® (GNC[™]) I included the results from two questions. This month I would like to share with you the results of two more questions asked of these principals.

3. Have you seen or heard of improved behavior on the part of the students who participate in Good News Club?

Number of responses	Response	Ratio
Yes	117	52.2%
No	85	37.9%
No responses	22	9.8%

4. What results have you observed or heard of in regards to the students or school as an outcome of the Good News Club?

180 principals responded to this question. Here are a few of those responses:

"Students of the Good News Club create lasting relationships with one another outside the academic setting of school. Students model lessons learned in the Good News Club during the school day. Students who might struggle with value choices at school are given great role models within the Good News Club. Parents of the Good News Club love having the safe haven of the school setting to enhance their child's academic and spiritual growth."

"Some of the students reference the lessons learned and will at least think twice before acting. It has also helped some of our students that do not make friends very easily find a common ground." "A couple of parents have had positive comments regarding their children's behavior and attitudes who are in the Good News Club."

"We have noticed an improvement in student behavior. Good News Club has provided us with an extra resource for our high risk population."

"They respond differently to their fellow students when there is a conflict."

"Since the Good News Club has been a part of our school, the office referrals have decreased."

"The students who are in the GNC rarely receive discipline referrals to the office. Undoubtedly, the club has been a successful part in our curbing bullying and classroom disrespect from children."

"I see it every day. What they are learning in the GNC is carried over. Students are more respectful and they are thinking twice about their behaviors."

"The students are better behaved and making better choices both personally and academically."

"I have had one student in particular that has had a behavior shift for the better and I know he loved attending the Good News Club. There were always lots of students in attendance and it grew each week as the word spread."

"I have heard them talking about the club when they come into the office early for help class. On Mondays some of the students would remind me that Good News Club was after school today and please don't forget to announce it! They know I need all the help I can get!!!"

"Students wanted to behave in class so they could continue to attend GNC even though class behavior did not impact their participation."
