As we approach the celebration of the Resurrection, I share with you one of my favorite true stories. It says so much about the lasting power of faith in Jesus' death and resurrection:

Most people have never heard of Nikolai Ivanovich Bukharin.

Bukharin was a participant in the 1917 Bolshevik Revolution, the editor of the Soviet newspaper Pravda, and a full member of the Politburo. His works on economics and political science are still read today.

In the spring of 1930, Nikolai addressed a huge assembly at Kiev. For over an hour he attacked Christianity using every argument from Russian Communism to prove atheism and discredit Christianity.

When he was finished, he looked at what seemed he deemed to be the smoldering ashes of Christian faith and demanded, "Are there any questions?"

Deafening silence filled the auditorium.

But then another Nicolai came to the platform and stood near the communist leader.

For some time he surveyed the silent crowd. Finally his voice reverberated throughout the auditorium as he invoked the ancient greeting of the Russian Orthodox Church:

"CHRIST IS RISEN!"

Suddenly the crowd stood. Their response sounded like thunder:

"HE IS RISEN INDEED!"

This Resurrection season we echo what has been said by Christians for nearly two centuries: "Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!"

Dan Evans & Family—CADENCE INTERNATIONAL



We are Dan, Erin, Caleb (15) and Audrey (10) Evans living in Eagle River, Alaska. We have been missionaries with Cadence International ministering in Germany since 1990. We were youth pastors for American Military Teens through Cadence Student Ministries (CSM), formerly Malachi.

In 2007 our hearts felt a tug toward the young U.S. Soldiers and Airmen. God had slowly been preparing us for this transition to Alaska. We have been blessed to serve in the JBER community since and LOVE IT!

The Chaplains at JBER Military in Anchorage, Alaska were funding us \$3300 a month to aid in our ministering to the troops. We teach them about the Bible and how to live and walk IN Christ. At the same time we feed them, work on their cars and houses while hugging and encouraging them in daily life. All of this would not be possible without this funding.

Military cutbacks have become so extreme that the chapels have lost over 50% of their operating budget. The chapel in turn had to redirect their monthly donations to cover their overhead expenses and we lost our funding. This is likely a permanent cutback. Times will continue to get rougher for military chapels; leaving all of the financial burden of our ministry on our mission churches and individual donors.

Currently GOCC is supporting the Evans with monthly stipend of \$200.00. They desperately need additional support through direct donations.

GOOD NEWS CLUBS "NEWS"

SHARING TRUTH WITHOUT FLUFF

When we speak to the children in our Good News Clubs, we sometimes use terms that are clear to us but mystifying to children. Their active minds usually translate those terms into something familiar. We will never know how many children have sung "with the jelly toast proclaim" until they finally learned that it was "with angelic host proclaim."

Our missionary Kim Calderon recently shared her son David's remark after learning about idolatry in preschool. He stated with great clarity, "I-dola-try is bad, but <u>The</u> Dollar Tree is good." (For David, this is a very important distinction to make, since he has fond memories of "dates" with Grandpa Jeff Moody that culminated in a trip to The Dollar Tree.)

One child in a Good News Club told her counselor, "I know God wants me to be His child, but I'm not sure I want to have a turtle life."

Recently, a Titusville Good News Club teacher announced, "Today we will learn about Abraham." One little boy asked curiously, "Lincoln?"

And how many Good News Club helpers have listened to the children recite their memory verse as, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only forgotten son...?"

A Bible teacher asked the children, "What do we know about God?" "He is an artist!" said a kindergarten boy. "You know, 'Our Father, who does art in Heaven...'" If we put together some actual ways that children have misquoted the Lord's Prayer, it would come out like this:

Our Father who does art in Heaven,

Harold be thy name

Give us this day our daily spread

And forgive us our trash baskets

as we forgive those who trash baskets against us.

Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us some E-mail.

For yours is the kingdom and the power and the gory

whatever whatever. Amen!

Our own Rosalind (Roz) Zahn, who has capably served as a Bible Teacher in many Good News Clubs, once overheard her little daughter singing, "And the rains came down and the fluff came up." "You know," Roz commented, "It's true. If the Devil can't divert us with the storms of life, he distracts us with a lot of the fluff!"

Her observation is so true of our lives, isn't it? It also reminds me of another truth: We can keep a lot of "fluff" out of the minds of the children in our lives by listening to them and by making a special effort to speak to them about Jesus in simple terms that they can clearly understand!

Please pray for all our Good News Clubs that the children will clearly hear and clearly understand the Truth. Pray that we will have enough volunteers to tell it to them. And please ask God if He wants you to be one!
